MEMPHIS, Tenn., Sept. 27.—G. V. Sanders, editor of the Memphis Press, has been cited to face trial in federal court for contempt of court.
The citation for his arrest was issued by Federal Judge J. Will Ross, following the publication of an editorial written by Sanders, and entitled "The King Forbids."
The editorial discussed the injunction granted Attorney General Daugherty in Chicago, and an injunction issued by Judge Ross here in the shopmen's strike.

JAILED EDITOR SCORES COURT

Says Action Makes Free Press Definition Difficult
G. V. Sanders, editor of the Memphis Press, who was arrested charged with contempt of court, has scored the action in arresting a fellow editor, Jacob Cohen, who was cited by the New York World to state his side of the case. The World published the following article in behalf of Sanders:
"His opinion was in behalf of Jacob Cohen, editor, that I took up the editorial sword against what I believed to be judicial tyranny. It was not in behalf of the railroad strikers. Not in behalf of editors—it was in behalf of American liberty, particularly the freedom of utterance. It was not that I agreed with the editorial utterances of Cohen, for which he had been deprived of his liberty by the courts.
