Hot water heat for the home has long been acknowledged by heating engineers to be the best known heating medium. It radiates a healthful warmth freely and uniformly throughout the rooms of the house, no matter how hard cold winds blow nor how low the mercury drops. Hot water boilers are made for the largest of buildings and the smallest of homes. Systems are arranged so that the boiler may be placed in the basement or on the main floor. In large buildings, basement installations are usually desirable. Recently, however, there has been placed in the hands of the heating engineer a hot water heating boiler that can be installed in a cellarless building.
