WASHINGTON, Oct. 10.—At conferences here and in New York this week efforts will be made to enlist strong administration support for the move to elect a republican senator from Texas.

R. B. Creager, Texas political leader and close personal and political friend of President Harding, left today for Chicago to urge Senator Medill McCormick, chairman of the republican senatorial campaign committee, to rush speakers into Texas and otherwise aid the candidacy of George Peedy, republican- coalition candidate, against Earle Mayfield, who received the democratic nomination.

Mayfield is being opposed on the grounds that he is a Ku Klux Klan candidate, rather than because he is a democrat.


