

New York Exchange List Shows Strength at Close

NEW YORK, Nov. 4.—Following the profit taking after opening, causing recessions from Friday's closing prices, the general list on the New York stock exchange showed strength today. Dulness was general during the early trading, but the volume increased when the reactionary tendency was supplanted by strength toward the close. As a group, copper showed the best tone, with gains of from 1 to 3 points.

BITTERLY LIKELY GRAIN MARKET CLOSING HIGHER TO STAY FIRM

CHICAGO, Nov. 4.—Grain prices closed higher on the Chicago board of trade today, owing to improved export demand. Provisions were strong.
December wheat opened off 1/4c at 11 1/2c and closed at that figure. It was up 1/4c to 11 3/4c, and closed at 11 3/4c. July opened up 1/4c at 10 1/4c, and closed at 10 1/4c.
