



NO VERDICT IN HARTFORD CASE

Jury Still Out in Trial of Mayor's Aide

The federal jury trying Nellie Hartford, Mayor Brown's special investigator, for illegal possession of narcotics, appeared to be almost hopelessly deadlocked at noon Friday. The case went to the jury Thursday afternoon, but has been unable to reach a decision. Shortly before 10 a. m. Friday the jury came out to ask for further instructions and then returned to the jury room. The closing session of the trial was marked by numerous brushes between attorneys—and sensational charges flew thick and fast against everybody connected with the case. John F. Dore, chief counsel for the defense, reached a climax in his closing address to the jury, when he declared that this was an exact parallel of the famous Rosenthal-Becker case, in New York—and that "the same booze and dope-selling ring of public officials that caused Legate to be murdered is now trying to railroad Nellie Hartford to prison."

"They would have murdered her, too," he declared. "If she hadn't been so carefully guarded by Mayor Brown. As they were unable to kill her body, they are now trying to kill her as a witness by putting her behind the bars."

District Attorney Tom Revell's speech was equally acrimonious, his principal attack centering on Mayor Brown, who, he said, "lieth to the city" when he testified that J. Howard Shattuck, state parole officer, had told him that the case against Mrs. Hartford would be dropped if he ceased his investigation of the Legate murder.

It came out for the first time Thursday, as the result of the Hartford case, that the Legate murder is still under investigation and that two men and a woman are being sought in connection with the crime. Mayor Brown asserted after the case had gone to the jury that Mrs. Hartford would be employed to find this trio "as soon as she is acquitted."

Famous Crossing Will Be Honored

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—Construction of a memorial bridge across the Delaware river at a point where Washington and his troops crossed before the battle of Trenton was authorized in a bill passed by the senate today.

Four other bridge bills were passed, including authority for construction of a bridge across the Colorado river at Yuma, Ariz.

NEWBERRY WILL LIVE IN PARIS

To Seek Seclusion After His Long Senate Fight

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—Seeking seclusion after the long, bitter fight that finally ended in his resignation from the senate, Truman H. Newberry is planning a voyage around the world. Later, he is considering deserting America entirely, to settle with his family in Paris.

Both Newberry and his wife are independently rich. Nearly every American parent with a child in school has contributed to the famous Newberry millions. Mrs. Newberry is one of the largest stockholders in the American Book Co., publishers of text-books, having inherited this from her father.

Newberry is a large stockholder in the Peacock Motors Co., but derived the bulk of his fortune from the increasing value of Detroit real estate.

GIRL REGRETS DEATH EFFORT

Experiencing a change of heart after she had swallowed poison late Thursday night at the Oxford hotel, Alice Nelson, 20, phoned to the hotel night clerk and told him to call for an ambulance because she was "sorry she had done it and wanted to live a while longer."

Miss Nelson was rushed to the city hospital. Physicians said that she had swallowed mercury tablets, which are often fatal after a length of time in which the poison works slowly thru the system. Several weeks will be required before it is known whether the girl will recover or not.

SHEIK'S DEATH CAUSES PROBE

CHICAGO, Dec. 15.—Scores of women were questioned today by detectives investigating the mysterious murder of Fred W. Keech, "the man who wanted to be a sheik."

Keech was shot to death in his second-hand clothing store here. Hundreds of letters from women, a notebook full of addresses and telephone numbers and scores of cards were found in the man's pockets. Keech was at one time wealthy. He owned a string of hotels and was commodore of the Muscatine, Iowa, boat club.

ARREST DEAD GIRL'S LOVER

SEASIDE, Ore., Dec. 15.—A young girl was dead here today, a suicide, and her former sweetheart was held by the police until the motive for the girl's death can be established.

Verna Lytle, 16, shot herself thru the temple in her mother's home here, dying instantly, according to a physician's report to the police late yesterday. The girl was said to be dependent. Howard Day, who was said to have been "keeping company" with the girl recently, has been arrested. No inquest will be held.

Weeks Asks Report on Astoria Relief

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—Secretary of War Weeks today wired war department officials at Portland to give him an immediate report of the situation at Astoria, Ore., where 5,000 persons are homeless as a result of last Saturday's fire. If the reports Weeks receives warrant, the joint resolution providing for the purchase of supplies, medicines and food, etc., will be rushed thru congress as an emergency measure.

The resolution now drawn, provides \$1,000,000, but this amount will be changed to conform to the reports from army engineers at the scene of the disaster.

Body of Banker Washed Ashore

NOGALES, Ariz., Dec. 15.—The body of William E. Brophy, Hisebe banker drowned in the Gulf of California November 13, was washed ashore near Guaymas yesterday, according to advices reaching here.

Aged Man Strangles on Dislodged Tooth

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Dec. 15.—Alfred Clarke, aged 70, was strangled to death by a tooth dislodged by falling against a door.

New Gold Fields Declared Richest

BUENOS AYRES, Dec. 15.—Reports of the discovery of a rich gold field in the Andes have reached here from Chile.
