## MELLON WANTS CHEAPER LABOR

Would Let Down Bars for Europe's Hordes

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—Let down immigration bars so that industries can import more "common labor," Secretary Mellon urges, in his annual treasury report. His recommendation is taken here as an administration drive at the present "3 per cent law," which is very much out of favor with some large industrial interests, particularly the steel industry.

Says Mellon: "Owing to the restrictions on immigration and the general resumption of industrial activity, the country is already suffering from a scarcity of labor which is embarrassing some lines of business, and leading to higher wage scales, where lower were expected a year ago."

Mellon's report has already brought the American Federation of Labor and the "labor bloc" in congress to the defensive.

If congress attempts to lift the immigration bars, the "labor bloc" will be ready with official statistics from U. S. Immigration Commissioner Husband showing that the British Isles, Scandinavia and Northern European countries are sending less than half their allocated quota of immigrants under the present stringent law.

This means that lifting the quota would result in a flood of immigrants from Southern and Eastern European countries, where working conditions are extremely low.

## Anti-Dope Fight Is Sweeping Siam

BANGKOK, Siam, Dec. 15.—Another anti-opium crusade was launched here today. The Red Cross Societies of the Far East, in convention here, adopted resolutions demanding that poppy growing be stopped in India and China, and that all nations cease traffic in opium and its derivatives. Campaigns were undertaken to fight beri-beri, leprosy, cholera, sleeping sickness and other Oriental diseases. Sir Claude Hill, London, president International Red Cross, presided. Red Cross leaders were present from America, England, France, Japan, China and almost all near and far Eastern countries.

## Australia Can't "See" Prohibition

PERTH, Australia, Dec. 15.—Australia is fed up on "Pussyfoot" Johnson. He was unable to hire a hall in which to speak anywhere in this city, and the Australian parliament refused to listen to him. "We want liquor. We've got liquor. We intend to keep liquor. You are a nuisance and please leave us alone." That was the message of Australia to Pussyfoot, printed on hand-bills and distributed during his stay here. He applied to parliament for permission to address it. "Sorry, busy," replied parliament.

## Berlin to Build First Skyscraper

BERLIN, Dec. 15.—Berlin will again attempt to build her first skyscraper—a nine-story edifice—on the shifting sands of Friedrichstrasse, the principal trade street of the city. All previous plans to emulate lower Manhattan have failed because of the loose soil upon which the buildings must find their foundations. The new "cloud scraper," as the skyscraper is called here, will be built to a height of 36 meters, whereas the highest buildings now run only from about 15 to 18 meters, or only five stories.

## League Asks Peru to Pay Back Dues

GENEVA, Dec. 15.—The league of nations has served peremptory notice on Peru that it is expected to pay \$150,000 dues, tho it has left the league.

## Marketing Plans Told; Co-operation Now Urged

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15.—Co-operative marketing among farmers promises "more help for the present relief and the permanent settlement of agricultural conditions" than any other single movement before the country, President Harding declared today in a message read before the National Council of Farmers' Co-operative Marketing association, in session here.

The president stated that he had a sincere conviction to do everything possible to aid agriculture, but said the farmers themselves should co-
