New York, Feb. 18.—A blizzard and snow storm has been raging all day. Snow came down and almost blocked street travel. The wind was from the northeast at twenty-five miles an hour. About ten inches had fallen by midnight, but it was then becoming thinner and the air turning colder. Poor families suffered greatly. The department of charity had to exert its utmost energies to assist sufferers.

**Alabama Suffers Too.**

Mobile, Ala., Feb. 18.—A blizzard reached Mobile today. The thermometer showed at 9 o'clock 21 degrees. It will go to 12 degrees before morning.

Richmond, Va., Feb. 18.—Snow has fallen steadily here and throughout the state today. Woodstock reports a depth of 20 inches.

**Sold a Township.**

J. A. Atkinson of Sylkeston, who has been spending a month in Iowa and Illinois looking after land sales and settlers, returned home today. He has concluded one of the largest real estate transactions of the season, and reports the sale of all the railroad lands in one township in northern Stutsman county. The entire township has changed hands, practically, as but two or three small pieces had previously been taken. Much of it can be farmed, and in fact Mr. Atkinson says the Russians in other parts of the state are working much rougher land than a part of this township. But the chief use to which the new owners will put their possessions will be in stock raising. There is plenty of hay and water. The price of the deal is not made public, and the purchasers are Iowa men. Mr. Atkinson says the prospects for immigration to this part of the state are good from where he has been. Laboring men and mechanics, with a little money ahead, are looking for a home and cheap lands, and a number may come up this spring. Several agents to work up the business were engaged in Illinois and Iowa. A great deal of land will be broken in Wells county this spring, more than ever before in any one year. The land sales at Sylkeston have been continuous during the winter.—Jamestown Alert.
