
Party Split Helped Wilson In 1912.

THE Democrats with Woodrow Wilson came back to power in the election of 1912. The Republican convention in Chicago nominated Taft, who was now opposed bitterly by Roosevelt. There were many contested delegates, and those in authority seated a majority of delegates with Taft proclivities.

Roosevelt had many warm supporters and was an avowed candidate. When Taft was nominated Roosevelt formed the Progressive party and ran on the third ticket. The vote in 1912 was: Wilson, 6,293,019; Roosevelt, 4,119,507; Taft, 3,484,956. Wilson received 435 votes in the electoral college, Roosevelt 88 and Taft 8. Thomas R. Marshall of Indiana was elected vice president.
