 Golden Lake Center School has 54 pupils enrolled which is as many as the Bladen school has, and that school has four teachers. The Center school has an eighth grade class of fifteen which is more than any other rural school or city school in Steele County has except Hope. Manual training and domestic science are taught and lunch is being served.  
 School district No. 1 in Riverside Twp., had a social December 3rd. It was given for the hot lunches. Every pupil in the school, including the boys, all take part in the preparing of it at noon. The school has an enrollment of 123, this is exceptionally large for this district as there were only five enrolled last year.

## 100 PER CENT REPORTED IN CASS CO. TOWNSHIPS

Townships in which every farmer within its bounds joined the county farm bureau were reported by the Cass County bureau in its drive for members. Cass, Ward and Barnes were the first counties in the state to begin the drive.

Two of the townships in which the canvas has been completed reported every member, another tvery member but one, while two others reported every farmer who was at home when the solicitors called. Those last two townships were Arthur and Dunkle, where Ed DeLaney signed up 75 farmers, all he met, in three days. In the townships as a whole, at least 90 per cent of the farmers have paid their \$10 annual membership in the county bureau. Several others report 95 per cent.

Early reports from Ward and Barnes Counties indicate 90 per cent of the farmers interviewed are joining the bureau, while the county officers expect 75 per cent or more of the farmers to be members when the drive is completed.

Among the counties that already are arranging for bureau membership drives later are Ramsey, Richland, Kidder, Walsh, Renville, Divide, Williams, McKenzie, Golden Valley and Slope.

The program of the American farm Bureau Federation, with which most of the counties will affiliate, is a big factor in drawing support of the farmers, organizers report. Its proposal of a wheat marketing plan, worked out by the Committee, is attracting wide interests among wheat farmers of the northwest.

## WAR WORKER TO ADDRESS SEED GROWERS CONVENTION

Dr. E. C. Perisho, former president of the South Dakota Agricultural College, and said to have addressed more soldiers during the World War than any other man in the country, will be one of the speakers at the Tri-State Grain and Stock Growers convention, to be held in Fargo January 18 to 21 inclusive. This is the twenty-second annual meeting.

Dr. Perisho was secured by the war department during the early days of the war to make inspirational addresses to the soldiers at the cantonments. He was so successful in this work that he was sent to France, and addressed troops all over the area occupied by the American Expeditionary Forces. He was attached to the American Army university at Beaune, France, in the spring of 1919, and also was stationed for a time at Brest, where he talked to the men waiting for ships to come home.  
 Several other men prominent in agricultural advancement are being secured for the convention. Several associations interested in special lines of farming will hold their meetings at the time of the convention.

Dr. John H. Worst, Bismarck, connected with the convention since its institution and largely responsible for its success, is the president this year. Other officers are G. W. Randle, vice president, and W. C. Palmer, secretary, both of the North Dakota Agricultural College.


