welfare of the nation? Is it not better, once for all and for all time, to assert your political manhood and womanhood and stand with Martin for governor just as you intend to stand for Borah for United States senator and just as you intend to stand for Roosevelt for president?

HOW THE PEOPLE MAY WIN.

The people of Idaho never had such an opportunity as is now presented them to regain the power invested in them by every right of justice in the universe as well as by the constitution, but which has been gradually taken away by encroachment of the interests, and it is likely they never again will have such another opportunity should they pass this one by.

The adherents of the special interests which have deprived the people of their inherent power to rule, are divided for the first time in the state's history whenever opportunity has offered the people to do something. They have divided before but such division came only when there was no fight being made by the people—only when they had secured control of both political parties and there was no effort on the part of the people to fight for their rights.

In the past whenever there was division between the parties such that one stood for special privilege and the other stood against it, the people were always divided between the two parties and the special interest affected, backed and supported by all other special interests, rallied to the support of the same candidates and the same party. Thus special privilege always won. Take the election of two years ago as an illustration.

This year in this state, as every one knows, neither of the old parties is attacking any special interest; neither has declared for a single legislative or executive principle in behalf of the people or in opposition to any special interest. The representatives of all special interests are in command of the policies and organizations of both parties. The mining trust, the timber syndicate, the wool trust, the sugar trust and all the rest had their representatives in control of the Republican platform convention and the Democratic state central committee.

They expected the people to submit mildly and acquiescently as they have always submitted. But the people did not submit. They have arisen in revolt. They have demanded that a ticket be named free from any such influences and such a ticket has been named.

Allegiance to the Democratic organization in this state now, means allegiance to the special interests; allegiance to the Republican state organization means the same allegiance to the same special interests. It is not asking much of the people to break away from such allegiance and to stand for the ticket that stands for the people. For a Democrat to break away from Democratic allegiance in Idaho is only a Democrat breaking away from Republican control, just as for a Republican to break away from Republican allegiance is only breaking away from Democratic control.

A Democrat to support the Progressive state ticket is voting against Republican influences and a Republican to support the Progressive state ticket is voting still against Democratic influences. Neither is leaving his own party but is still fighting the old opposing party as represented by the same old opposing principle.

The people should be united in this, while the special interests are divided. That is how the Progressive state ticket will win a victory for the people against entrenched corporate and special privilege interests.

The Evening Story

A SINGULAR CASE.

A detective, I was sent to investigate a case where a young married man had received a bottle of wine by express. The sender's name was not on the box containing it, and naturally the recipient was suspicious of it.

The first thing I did was to sit down with him and in a long interview drew out all the information he gave me that might furnish me with a clew. But unfortunately no clew was to be extracted from anything he said. He had no enemies, man or woman. He was happily married, and his wife had recently presented him with their first child, a fine boy.

My next move was an examination of the handwriting of the address on the box in which the wine had been received. I was told that it was not the writing of any one he had ever known, though some one of his acquaintances might have written it, disguising the hand. There was no use giving it to an expert in chirography until I could furnish a specimen of the writing of some person or persons who might have committed the crime.

We detectives in cases where we have no clew usually begin at home, so to speak, and work outward. But in this case there seemed nothing for me to investigate within the household. It consisted of Mr. Gordon, the man upon whom the attempt at murder had been made; his wife, who loved him dearly, and one servant, a woman who had lived with them a short time and could have no possible motive whatever for taking his life.

Desiring to leave no stone unturned in eliciting information, I asked for an interview with Mrs. Gordon. I went over a ground with her supplementary to that I had gone over with her husband, but could not elicit a word as to relations Mr. Gordon had had with any one that could possibly lead to a motive for murder. But a day or two later I received a note from the lady mentioning a fact she had forgotten.

It is only of late years that insanity has begun to be carefully studied with reference to crime. We first heard of their relationship in criminal cases of so called emotional insanity. We now hear of it in cases where the symptoms are very subtle.

Not for the world would I betray the secret on which I had stumbled until I had gained an insight into whether Mrs. Gordon had really attempted the crime and if she had whether she did so in her right mind. I knew that since the birth of her child the physician who had attended her on that occasion had made her other visits.

There are two conditions in families—the doctor and the pastor. I concluded to confide my secret to the doctor.

I called on him in his house and asked him if he had ever noticed any evidence of insanity in Mrs. Gordon. He looked at me with a very singular expression and asked me why I wished to know. I replied that I desired a reply to my question, whereupon he claimed that the secrets of his profession were sacred property.

Not till I had told him the whole story did he confess that he had suspected her ever since the birth of her child of puerperal insanity. It had shown itself in a feeling of hatred for her husband, which had been noticed only by the doctor. He had been looking for confirmatory symptoms, but had thus far not detected any. He was very much checked and suggested that I say nothing about the matter for the present since the news might affect the patient's husband.

I was glad enough to throw the responsibility all upon his shoulders. He told Gordon that he suspected his wife was suffering from postnatal insanity and that she might be carefully watched. I learned from the doctor later that she had entirely recovered and that her husband did not know that she had tried to kill him.
