

LATE CRAWFORDS COME TO MARKET

Offerings of Late Variety Are Still Light—The Day's Quotations.

For the first time this season, Late Crawford peaches are on the markets. While they are not yet abundant, some of the fruit stores have received their first shipments of them and are prepared to meet the first of those who come.



FAIR CONDEMNED BY PRESBYTERY. Members of Denomination Are Urged to Withhold Their Patronage.

(Capital News Special Service) Roswell, Sept. 19.—At the annual meeting of the Boise Presbytery, held at the Sterry Memorial Presbyterian church, strong resolutions were passed, urging the pastors and Christian people to withhold their patronage from the state fair unless all gambling devices are prohibited.

There were present 19 ministers and 170 elders from over the Presbytery, representing almost every church on the roll.

Five automobiles furnished by Roswell and Parma people met the delegates at Parma and conveyed them to the church, three miles south. The party was given a fine ride over the new Roswell fruit tract, the upper bench and also over the Roswell bench before being taken to the church.
