

LEAGUE BEING ORGANIZED FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE OF DEFEAT OF BORAH

Paper Circulated By L. Cobb and A. E. Carlson — Would Pledge Members to Support Only Reactionary Republicans

will be known as the Republican League of Idaho.

Petitions soliciting membership for this organization are now in circulation in Boise and Ada county and are to be used by Idaho's junior senator's enemies in other counties in the state where there are rabid and vicious standpat Republicans, who are advocates of reactionary policies, the enemies of progressive Republicans, and while sadly in the minority and driven to bay, they are showing what they claim is true Republicanism by fighting the party's direct primary candidates not only in this but other counties, declare those who are aware of the movement, and know to a man who is behind it.

Disatisfied Element at Work.

Disatisfied and dissatisfied because they were completely routed and crushingly defeated at the Republican primaries, none of their candidates surviving the turndown administered by the electors at large in this county, the self-appointed standpat Republicans in Ada county who believe that the proper way to expose their brand is to use a long political knife on those candidates who have the backing of the people, have banded to act co-operatively in their desperate fight to defeat the party's candidates.

In Boise L. Cobb, representative of the Barber Lumber company, a subsidiary of the Weyerhaeuser lumber syndicate, one of, if not the greatest lumbering corporation in the United States, in company with A. E. Carlson, a local merchant, well known as a mining man who is a stockholder in numerous mining companies, are circulating the petitions for the Republican League of Idaho, in Boise and Ada county endeavoring to obtain signatures. They have so far succeeded in securing the names of a number of defeated candidates at the primary election and a few of the friends of these standpat candidates. Outside of this small circle the petitions have been circulated but little, but it has been given with authority that every Republican will be confronted with the petition and will either have to sign it or turn it down.

An Illegitimate Child.

Although the by-laws and constitution of the newborn league has been cleverly drawn, this association, dubbed the illegitimate child of the Republican party in Boise, Ada county and Idaho, has buried in it, in section 2, a remarkable pledge that exposes the sole purpose of the party knifers and, it is pointed out by friends of the party, those who are asked to join the organization should closely read this before they sign.

This pledge, which had the founders of the league been honest in their intentions, it is claimed, would have been the first section of the constitution, is as follows:

"We pledge him (William Howard Taft) our support for re-election; and, further, we oppose the election of any candidate as a Republican who does not work to that end."

In other words, every Republican candidate, particularly county, who does not countenance the theft of the nomination for president at Chicago, is marked for slaughter by the members of the new organization, if it is within their power, which is far from probable, and regardless of the fact that the primaries elected these candidates.

Is an Attack on Borah.

The reactionaries, the conservatives, the corporation and interest representatives, the enemies of the Black law who seek to repeal it, are rallying, it is said, to the new organization. Politically speaking, assert those who have watched the movement which has been secretly carried on the gumshoe campaign for signatures, a corpora's guard is already enrolled.

Those friends within the Republican party who realize that the sole object of the Republican League of Idaho is to defeat the junior senator for re-election, those Republicans who are active in the support of the party's interests and wish to be successful this fall, are not signing the petitions for membership and stand opposed to the policy of carrying on a guerilla warfare of this kind within the party.

Majority Does Not Rule.

The constitution of the Republican League of Idaho, which Republicans say should have a big question mark placed after the title, contains a provision relative to the business of the league and its regulation which provides, in the usual standpat style characteristic of its backers, that the constitution shall not be altered or amended, or a new constitution adopted, "except by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the league." With the new league a majority does not rule, its ardent backers evidently having in mind the Chicago convention, but there must be two-thirds in favor of a change in the constitution before it can be altered.

The three main clauses of the constitution of the pet league of the reactionaries, and in fact its cardinal provisions are as follows:

"Section 1. The name of this organization is 'The Republican League of Idaho.'

Sec. 2. Purposes: To maintain the principles of the Republican party as established by Abraham Lincoln, under which our country has transcended in moral and material growth the nations of the world; to assist in the preservation of the constitution of the United States; to propagate and disseminate the lessons of patriotism as handed down to us by the fathers and those able statesmen under whose guidance the Republican party achieved its greatest success in statecraft for the benefit of the whole people and the glory of the republic.

Sec. 3. We endorse the wise and patriotic administration of William H. Taft as president of the United States, believing it to be a faithful example of the principles of the Republican party, entitling him to re-election to the office of president. We pledge him our support for re-election; and, further, we oppose the election of any candidate as a Republican who does not work to that end."

That clause of the constitution relating to the two-thirds vote is as follows:

"Subject to the provisions hereof, the business of the league in all its phases shall be regulated and controlled by a code of by-laws to be adopted, but this constitution shall not be altered or amended, or a new constitution adopted, except by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the league at a regular meeting thereof."

BEAR LAKE FAILS TO INDORSE BORAH

Name of Senator Does Not Appear in the Resolutions Adopted.

The Bear Lake county Republican candidates carefully refrained from pledging their legislative candidates to vote for Senator William E. Borah for United States senator, when they met a few days ago and promulgated and adopted a platform. To Bear Lake county is given the distinction of being the first of the 27 in the state to ignore the pledge. Unless the legislative candidates individually or collectively pledge their votes to the junior senator, it will be impossible to place the most southeastern county in the state so far as the interests of Senator Borah are concerned.

The platform indorses the national and state platforms but makes no reference to Senator Borah even failing to pay a tribute to the junior senator for his record during his first term as United States senator, although this record is unparalleled by any other member of that distinguished body during the past six years.

The Bear Lake county candidates' platform is as follows:

We, the nominees of the Republican party of Bear Lake county, Idaho, do hereby declare the following to be our platform of principles and pledges, adopted this the seventeenth day of September, 1912, in accordance with the provision of section 29 of the election laws of the state of Idaho:

We hereby reaffirm our allegiance to the principles of the Republican party and heartily indorse the national and state platforms adopted by said party.

We favor good schools and good roads, believing that the former is the foundation of good citizenship and the latter the foundation of material development, and pledge our nominees to bring about these conditions as fully as the resources of the county permit.

Realizing the gradual increase in the taxes of the people and the growing indebtedness of the county, we pledge our nominees to economy in the expenditure of the public funds so that the burden of taxation may be lessened as speedily as possible.

BURRELL RESIGNS AS A CANDIDATE

Man Who Fills His Place Is Pledged to Vote for Senator Borah.

Stepping aside as a Republican candidate for the legislature from Bear Lake county because of business reasons, but tendering his resignation only with the understanding that the candidate to succeed him pledge his vote in the legislature to Senator W. E. Borah, E. A. Burrell, former lieutenant governor of Idaho, who was nominated at the primaries in Bear Lake county as a candidate to the legislature, placed his resignation in the hands of the county committee. It was accepted with the proviso and C. E. Wright, editor of the Examiner of Montpelier, was selected to fill the vacancy, who pledged his vote to Senator Borah.

Mr. Burrell's nomination was filed against his wishes as he felt he could not spare the time to go to the legislature, if nominated and elected. His friends urged him to remain on the ticket and he was nominated. His election last week to the office of grand master of the Masonic grand lodge of Idaho prompted him to retire from the political field this year, owing to the fact the office will require a great deal of attention and therefore he handed his resignation to the committee. It is in the following form:

Montpelier, Idaho, Sept. 17, 1912.

To the Republican county central committee of Bear Lake county, at Paris, Idaho.

Gentlemen: On the understanding that the person selected by your committee to take my place on the Republican county ticket for the position of state representative publicly pledges himself, if elected, to vote as such representative for William E. Borah for the office of United States senator to succeed himself, provided he does not vote and work for a third party ticket in Idaho. I hereby tender my resignation as the regularly constituted nominee of the Republican party for the office of state representative. Respectfully submitted,
