

KESSLER OUT FOR STATE TICKET OF THE THIRD PARTY

Letter Is Result of Statement Made by J. H. Peterson—Praises Martin and States His Position.

Harry E. Kessler, who was one of the many mentioned in a recent letter of J. H. Peterson as progressive Republicans who are not supporting the Progressive state ticket, is out in a letter today to State Chairman Gipson of the Progressive committee, declaring that he is for G. H. Martin, the Progressive nominee for governor, and moreover, declares that had it not been for the excellent state ticket nominated by that party, thousands of voters in the state would have been disfranchised.

Mr. Kessler declares he will support Wilson for president, the Progressive state ticket for state officers and the Republican legislative ticket in order to secure the return of Senator Borah to the United States senate. His letter is as follows:

September 26, 1912.
Mr. J. H. Gipson,
State Chairman Progressive Party,
Boise, Idaho.
Dear Sir: I have yours of yesterday referring to the mention made to me by Mr. Peterson in his published letter of a day or two ago and asking me to define my position in regard to state affairs.
My individual political convictions are of little importance but I have no hesitancy in stating them to you frankly. I believe firmly in the freest rule of the people and propose to support those candidates regardless of party, that I believe are most free from all alliances with the special interests that thrive upon governmental favor. I am therefore not ready to support for president either the idol of your party or the leader heading that party so ably praised by Mr. Peterson. The recent stand and past deeds of Woodrow Wilson to my mind stamp him as the apostle of avarice and fastest progress. On the other hand I do not believe that any party or its candidates have a monopoly on virtue on political wisdom and I think that any movement that raises itself to the dignity of a strong political party has an excuse for existence. In my opinion the Progressive state ticket at least as to several of its candidates stands

most surely for the policy of the rule of the people as related to state problems.
This is especially true as to the candidate on your ticket for governor. Had not the progressive leaders placed before the voters the name of Mr. Martin, thousands of our citizens would have refused to vote for governor. It is a remarkable fact that although Mr. Hawley had no opposition in his party at the primaries, yet the combined preferences for both he and Mr. Haines as expressed by the vote represented less than one-half of the total vote cast at the primaries and not more than one-fifth of the total vote of the state. Besides both Mr. Haines and Mr. Hawley represent so nearly the same policies, that the voters who expressed a preference for one would in most instances be willing to vote for the other.

While the great body of the voters who I believe disapprove of the policies of both Mr. Haines and Mr. Hawley would have felt that they could not conscientiously have voted for either and would have in effect been disfranchised so far as that office is concerned, had not your party filed the name of Mr. Martin who I believe is a thoroughly progressive and capable candidate for that high office.

Now lest some should think me partial, I want to state that I am most heartily supporting the entire county Republican ticket and it will behoove every voter to most thoughtfully vote his legislative ticket lest he help elect to the legislature some one who may vote against the re-election of our brilliant and worthy senator whose term is about to expire and who may vote for the election of a reactionary Democrat for United States from Idaho.

The United States senate is the remaining stronghold for the protection of privilege and a senator from Idaho is as important as a senator from any other state in the Union.

MR. MARTIN ANSWERED.
Hon. George H. Martin, Progressive candidate for governor, attacks Governor Hawley as a member of the state land board for voting against the sale of 18,000 acres of land to the Potlatch Lumber company, while stating that if he owned the land personally he would have been glad to sell at the price offered. The question is easily answered by the record. In Governor Hawley's report to the land board after a personal examination of the lands by which some 6000 acres of agricultural lands were exempted from the sale, the company having applied for the purchase of 24,000 acres, the governor says:

"As a preliminary I would state that in my judgment it is NOT A PROPER GOVERNMENTAL POLICY TO PERMIT ANY CORPORATION OR ANY INDIVIDUAL TO OBTAIN THE FEE SIMPLE TITLE TO LARGE AREAS OF LAND BECAUSE NO MONOPOLY COULD BE SO OPPRESSIVE TO THE PEOPLE IN THE FUTURE AS THE MONOPOLY OF LAND. I realize, however, that in carrying on extensive lumbering operations it becomes absolutely necessary for the owners to acquire great areas of timber lands for only by so doing can they carry on their operations successfully for many years and thus be properly reimbursed for the immense capital required as a preliminary expense in acquiring lands, building mills, etc., for their future operations. While the Potlatch company is at the present time the owner in its own right of over twenty-eight hundred square miles of timber lands in the section I have mentioned, and the acquisition of title to the lands in question would make only a comparatively small increase in proportion to their present vast holdings, still I do not believe it good policy to part with the ultimate title even under such circumstances and even under the opinion I hold as to the major part of the lands in question not being fitted for real agricultural purposes."
