

OFFERINGS LIGHT ON LOCAL MARKET

The Supply of Ranch Butter Is Light—Last Water-melons.

Offerings were somewhat slow in the market this morning and but little produce was purchased. Ranch butter was somewhat easier this morning, but the supply is still low. The last watermelons of the season were on the market today and sold at one cent per pound. The chicken market is well supplied this week, the hog market is a little unsteady with the cattle market stiff. Following are the prevailing prices:



FORECAST FOR BOISE AND VICINITY—Fair tonight with freezing temperature. Thursday fair.

DAILY REPORT—Highest temperature yesterday, 52; lowest temperature this morning, 31; mean temperature yesterday, 44. Total precipitation for the 24 hours ending at 8 a. m., .14 of an inch.

CONDITIONS—A great area of low barometric pressure extends from the south Pacific coast to the Mississippi

river and lake region, attended by precipitation at a large number of stations in the territory covered. The heaviest precipitation reported was 1 inch at Des Moines, Ia. Snow is falling in Montana and sleet in Manitoba. An area of high pressure overlies the eastern states, attended by fair weather in that section, and another occupies the northwest, giving promise of fair weather in the vicinity. Cooler weather prevails in the west with freezing

temperatures as far south as Nevada and the first killing frost of the season at Boise. It is much warmer in the Ohio and middle Mississippi valleys and the Lake region.
