TRACK IS MUDDY BUT RACES GOOD

Tuesday's Speed Program Pleases the Crowd at Fair Grounds.

Mud and sloop formed the race course at the Inter-Mountain fair yesterday. The ponies threw it in the air with every leap toward the wire. The riders were covered with it. Races and showers alternated on the program all through the afternoon. The small crowd in the grandstand ran to shelter in the top seats during the shower and back down on the front seats during the races.

Several of the schedules were scratched yesterday on account of the rain and the small attendance. The first race, 2:25 pace, with a \$1000 purse, was called off and will be run today on the hopes of a better track and less mud. The time was poor on account of the heavy mud but the crowd didn't care for that fact and grew as excited over the finish of some of the numbers as though the course had been in perfect condition and the period a record-breaker.

In what was scheduled for the fourth race and a full mile, Galen Gale led the ponies from the jump all of the way around the course. He started off on the jump and none of the other ponies were able to get their nose anywhere in a line with his flanks. Kellesey was up again and he rode like a whirlwind, even on the muddy track and fighting against the slippery course. Soon and Rather Royle fought hard for second but the former came in under the wire ahead. La Taranta, who was the favorite at the ring, did not come up to the expectations yesterday and her backers were somewhat disappointed over the showing that she made.

Good Sport Provided. All of the races were good in spite of the track. Beau Man, ridden by Rettig, didn't get started off well, but he made up time and finally drove in under the wire in the third place. Pretty Soon led the bunch as they dashed around the home stretch and McMartin gave him his lead until he finished first. Tempo Standard, driven by Parker, held to second place and finished that way under the wire. Sidney Peters, who was strong at the ring, finished fifth in the race.

Shrimp monkeyed around at the post for fully 12 minutes and held the ponies there in the rain before he would make up his mind to start right. He seemed to be a remarkably good horse but he insisted on running a furlong before he would come back to the post and behave himself. When he did make it, he finished third in the line but he ate up the ground after he got started. Hero, ridden by Benton, led the course, with Jack Wilson making a close fight. Enchanter and Balreod were close behind. At the mutuels Hero came in with \$10.00 to the shot.

Floyd S. Warden Snook's entry, flew over the mud with O'Brien on her back, making four wires during the meet for the rider. Charlotte B brought Pinne-gar in close behind with Teddy R making trouble less than half a length away. Jim R, who looked good, was evidently not satisfied with the condition of the track for he came in quite a distance behind.


