## NEW YORK WINS IN THE FIRST INNING; FIVE RUNS ARE MADE

### Giants Turn Tide and Knock O'Brien Out of Box in Short Order—Marquard in Form

Polo Grounds, New York, Oct. 14.—The New York Giants today overcame the Bostons by a score of 5 to 2 before a crowd of about 25,000 people. New York's victory was a check to the hopes of the Red Sox team, which expected to win today's game and capture the world's series. The struggle for the world's championship of 1912 now stands, Boston three games won, New York two games won and one game tied. The teams play tomorrow in Boston.

O'Brien, the Red Sox first pitcher, was knocked out of the box in the first inning when New York made five runs. Collins went in for Boston in the second inning and there was no further scoring.

Marquard pitched a superb game for the Giants and outside of the second inning the Red Sox were helpless before his mystifying curves. After the game was over the managers of the clubs tossed the coin to determine in which city the deciding game should be played in the event New York won tomorrow in Boston. Manager Stahl called tails and it fell tails, and the deciding game will be played in that city.

New York, Oct. 14.—The Giants made their stand today. Before a crowd of 25,000 the National champions struggled to check the march of the Boston Americans, who needed only one more victory to earn the title to the world's championship. The Giants needed the rest of the game to win. There was plenty of room for everyone, and vacant tiers of seats in the outfield bleachers and lower stands before the game was begun. The day was cheerless. Cold, gray clouds screened the sun.

There was no more trouble in getting seats today than any preceding day of the series. The early crowds were easily accommodated and the late comers found plenty of space. ### GREAT FIGHTING FLEET REVIEWED IN THE HUDSON

**President and Secretary of the Navy See Mammoth Naval Pageant—Mobilization About Over.**

New York, Oct. 14.—America's greatest fighting fleet lay spick and span with shining rails and spotless decks on the Hudson today, for review by President Taft and Secretary of the Navy Meyer. This, with the review by the president tomorrow as the fleet steams out of the harbor, will end the official three-day program of mobilization. Tonight on the eve of the fleet's departure, the program will end in an official demonstration in New York's famous hotels in honor of the president, cabinet and 600 officers of the fleet.

As the first act of the official program the gunboat Nashville, given over to the press, today anchored near the flagship Connecticut off Seventy-ninth street. She conveyed the Dolphin, which had aboard Secretary Meyer and his aides. The usual salutes were exchanged between the Dolphin and the Connecticut. Rear Admiral Osterhaus, commander of the fleet, Rear Admirals Fiske, Usher, Winslow and Fletcher, boarded the Dolphin after she came to anchor. Then came craft carrying members of the house and senate naval committees. Secretary Meyer returned immediately after the visit of Rear Admiral Osterhaus, and with him left the Connecticut to inspect the super-dreadnoughts, Wyoming and Arkansas, anchored just above the flagship. The division commanders returned to the fleet by Secretary Meyer which followed the inspection of the super-dreadnoughts, the Dolphin was followed by the steamer Henry Hudson, with the mayor's committee aboard.
