WALL STREET IS FINANCING THE TAFT CAMPAIGN

O. K. Davis Sends Long Telegram to Chairman Gipson Telling of Recent Disclosures in East.

That the claims of the supporters of Roosevelt that the Taft campaign has been financed and supported by Wall street and the steel trust has been established beyond possibility of denial, is the information sent to State Chairman Gipson in a message received yesterday from national headquarters, which points out that the heaviest contributors to the Taft campaign fund have been Andrew Carnegie, head of the steel trust; J. P. Morgan & Co., head of Wall street influences; H. C. Frick, also a steel trust man; George F. Baker and no less than five of the directors of the United States steel corporation and four members of the finance committee of that great trust.

It is pointed out that the evidence heard before the United States senate investigation committee, which has just adjourned, establishes the falsity of the statement sent out by Chairman Hillis of the Republican national committee, who must have known the real truth when he lied about the campaign funds of the Roosevelt committee. The telegram, which is from O. K. Davis, secretary of the Progressive National committee, is as follows:

New York, Oct. 26, 1912.

J. H. Gipson,
Boise, Idaho.

The Republican national committee have steadily refused to make public any of their campaign contributions, until today when, under the federal law, they were compelled to file a statement in Washington, this being the very last day they could file and comply with the law.

The list made public this afternoon shows contributors are made up largely of Wall street men—bankers, capitalists and corporation people generally. Among the principal contributors are Andrew Carnegie, J. P. Morgan & Co., H. C. Frick, George F. Baker, at least five of the directors of the United States Steel corporation and four members of the steel corporation finance

POLL IN CANYON COUNTY SHOWING COLONEL IN LEAD

A poll taken at a public sale which was held at Middleton, Canyon county, last Friday, at which there were 200 farmers present, gave Roosevelt and Martin 157 votes, the other 43 being scattered between Wilson, Taft and Debs and the candidates for governor on the Republican, Democratic and Socialist state tickets. This proportion of farmer votes for the Progressive ticket holds good throughout the farming districts of Canyon and Washington counties. In Ada county the proportion will be even larger for the Progressive candidates.

Reports received at Progressive headquarters are to the effect that approximately the same ratio of votes holds good in the farming communities throughout the state. The farmer vote of the state is more than half the total vote of the state and better than two-thirds of that vote will be cast for Roosevelt and Martin, while these candidates will receive about one-third or better of the village and city vote, the other two-thirds of that vote being divided approximately even between Hawley and Haines and between Wilson and Taft, according to reports received at Progressive state headquarters from every county in the state. This does not take account of the Socialist vote, which will probably be about 5000 in the state, many who had intended voting the Socialist ticket having switched to Roosevelt and Martin.

A complete organization has now been perfected in every county in the state, the last county unorganized having reported a complete organization today. This guarantees a live, active committeeman in every precinct in the state who will be present at the polls with assistants to work for the success of the ticket. In addition to the men workers, Mrs. Paul Clagstone, state chairman of the women's organization, reports that in most of the north Idaho precincts there will be women workers at the polls and other volunteer women workers stationed near the polls to greet women on the way to vote. These workers will explain in detail to the women voters how to write in the names of the Roosevelt electors.

Progressives all over the state are making it a matter for personal pride to show how intelligent Idaho voters are by accomplishing the unprecedented thing of carrying the state by writing in the names of the electors.

It is believed that this thing will advertise Idaho better than a million dollars spent in the usual channels, as it will be a matter for press comment the world over. The Progressives are as confident it can be done as they are that election day will arrive.

BIG MINING COMPANY HAS FILED ARTICLES
