JOHNSON'S SPEED WONDER OF THE BASEBALL WORLD

He Throws the Ball 122 Feet a Second, or at the Rate of 83 Miles an Hour—Not His Best Speed.

Comparisons With Johnson's Speed. Here are some approximate comparisons of the speed of Walter Johnson's first ball with the velocity of automobiles, ice-boats, aeroplanes, running horse and John Paul Jones, world's champion miler.

In a test of his speed at the Remington Arms company, Bridgeport, Conn., Walter Johnson, the Climbers' great pitcher and Idaho find, threw an official league ball 122 feet per second. He did this without warming up and in his street clothes.

Rucker then had his second test, and his speed was also faster. The record for Nap's second attempt was 109 feet per second. Then Rucker tried a curve ball, but this proved too slow to record.

In his last try Johnson made his best record, 122 feet a second. Rucker also had another chance, and he increased his speed by four feet, the ball traveling through the air at the rate of 112 feet a second.

After the test Rucker said Johnson had not thrown at his full speed, and that if he had he could have thrown over 150 feet in a second.

The speed for the new government Colt, .45-calibre automatic revolver is 800 feet per second. A high-power hunting rifle, .35-calibre, auto-loading, has a velocity of 2,000 feet per second.
