

FOUR ENTERED IN THE BATTLE FOR HEYBURN'S SEAT

James H. Brady, Frank R. Gooding, James F. Ailshie and Charles W. Beale Avowed Candidates.

If there existed a doubt in the minds of the legislative members-elect in Idaho that there are three prominent public men of this state—ex-Governor James H. Brady, ex-Governor Frank R. Gooding and Judge James F. Ailshie—in the race for the senatorial seat to succeed the late Weldon B. Heyburn, it has been removed, for they have been given official notification of the fact by personal word and letter.

Divided North.

The prospects now are that several other candidates will cast their hats into the ring. Charles W. Beale of Wallace, defeated at the last primary held in this state for the nomination for congressman, has been urged to launch his candidacy and has done so. Mr. Beale has been before the election in this state as a candidate for congressman on several different occasions and has been defeated. His candidacy, however, is viewed with some significance by party leaders here because it is taken as an indication that the six northern counties are not solidly behind Justice Ailshie, considered the north Idaho candidate, and the panhandle will enter the legislature divided against itself.

Means Dividing Wedge.

It is conceded that Mr. Beale has driven the wedge into what had been believed the solid Ailshie north, and the gap is liable to be widened by the launching of the candidacy of other aspirants from that section of the state including James Babb, a prominent and well-known attorney of Lewiston. While there has been wide speculation on the possible attitude that Congressman Burton L. French will assume with respect to the short senatorial term, it is believed here by many of his close friends that he will become a candidate before the legislature.

Fight on Ailshie.

The fight on Judge Ailshie involves his attitude on the recent disfranchising opinion of the supreme court which cut off the Roosevelt presidential electors and forced the Progressives to write in their names. This opinion was written by Judge Ailshie. It was unanimous so far as the court was concerned, having been concurred in by Chief Justice Stewart and Justice Sullivan. Some idea of the intense feeling that existed after this opinion was handed down can be obtained from the vote cast for presidential electors at the election for approximately 25,000 voters in this state wrote in the name of the Roosevelt electors as against approximately 31,000 voters who cast their ballots for Woodrow Wilson, giving him Idaho's electoral vote. Judge Ailshie is held largely responsible for this opinion in view of the fact he wrote it. That it will have a serious effect on his senatorial aspirations is admitted. Just how serious this effect may be remains to be seen. Justice Ailshie is a candidate for United States senator and has the support of many admiring friends.

Governor Brady Active.

Governor Brady, apparently greatly interested in senatorial developments, is an active candidate for the office, but is making little if any show of his

and prescribe such rules for the measurement of vessels and such regulations as may be necessary and proper to carry this proclamation into full force and effect. American coastwise shipping was exempted from toll payment by congress. It was to this provision of the act that Great Britain protested. American naval vessels are exempted without specific mention either in the act of congress or the proclamation, because the authorities believe it unnecessary to explain the uselessness of payment from its navy department pocket to the one belonging to the treasury department.

The rates named in the proclamation are practically the same as those which will be in force at the Suez canal next year. The president based his declaration of rates upon the report and investigations of Professor Emory R. Johnson of the University of Pennsylvania, an expert designated by executive order for the task.

Shipping Awaited Report.

The report has been awaited with interest by shipping interests throughout the world. According to Professor Johnson's report to the president, also made public last night, the Panama canal should be upon a self-sustaining basis in 20 years. It should compete successfully with the Suez route for the traffic of Europe with South American west coast points and with New Zealand, but cannot be expected to compete successfully for Europe's trade to the far east.

Taking the estimates of the canal commission for expenses of operation and maintenance of the canal, and for the improvement held to be necessary at the end of a decade, Professor Johnson figures, that the rate per net ton can be reduced at the end of 10 years to \$1. Even with this rate, which he says probably will correspond closely, with the rate that may then be enforced through the Suez canal, the United States will obtain enough revenue from foreign vessels to pay all fixed charges, provide a sinking fund of 1 per cent to retire the Panama canal bonds, and still find a yearly balance.
