HUMPHRIES EXONERATED BY BOARD, BUT GOVERNOR HAWLEY DISSENTS

Executive Declares That Charges Are Sustained and Renews His Criticism of the Institution as Conducted

EXCERPTS FROM MINORITY REPORT OF GOVERNOR. "I conclude from my examination of the evidence that the institution from its inception has been conducted on improper lines...

Governor Hawley made the above recommendations in his reports on findings on the evidence, which proved to be the minority one, in the Idaho Industrial Training school investigation...

System is Wrong. "In this institution, although as governor made ex-officio a member of its governing board, I have had nothing to do outside of that general interest and partial supervision exercised in my capacity as governor...

Shocked at Treatment. "I was very much shocked when the mistreatment of the Greer boy was called to my attention, and resolved that such an infraction of the rules which should govern an institution of this kind should not be lightly passed by...

Conducted on Improper Lines. "I have carefully read the testimony taken during the long investigation that followed this investigation. I took a wider scope than any of us had anticipated, but Mr. Hill wisely concluded that having gone into the matter, it should be finished in its entirety and most thoroughly...

"Upon reaching St. Anthony I found that Mr. Hill and Mrs. Pugmire two members of the board were present. Mrs. Worthman, another member of the board, was unavoidably detained by illness. Miss Shepherd, superintendent of public instruction, joined us shortly after the investigation commenced...

"I was unwilling to believe that Superintendent Humphries was responsible for the mistreatment of the Greer boy or was privy to the unwarrantable beating that had been administered to him. I was assured by Mr. Humphries upon reaching St. Anthony that he had not in any wise been a party to the matter, but, on the contrary, as soon as it was called to his attention had summarily discharged the guilty party and insisted upon his punishment through the law...

MANY ARRESTS FOR SELLING OF DRUGS

Government Opens a Campaign Against the "Pill" Doctors

COAST STATES CHIEF PLACE OF OPERATION

Proposed to Put Stop to Use of Government Mails for Advertising Criminal Practices in Connection With Race Suicide.

Washington, Nov. 20.—Postoffice inspectors and United States marshals in 72 leading cities of the country began today practically simultaneous raids for the arrest of 173 persons charged with using the mails to promote criminal medical practices or sale of drugs and instruments used for illegal purposes...

All arrests are to be made for violation of the section of the penal code which bars from the mails any vile or obscene matter whether sealed or unsealed, any advertisement, letter or circular, proposing or suggesting criminal practices, or any packet containing any substance, drug or thing intended to be used for immoral or unlawful purposes...

Chief Inspector Sharp, of the post office department and many of his force of inspectors, have been working on the cases for many months. Strict enforcement of municipal and state laws in the east is said by postal authorities to account for the comparatively few arrests in large cities, but the inspector says the horde of this sort of criminal practice is in the Pacific coast cities...

Approximately 20 per cent of those arrested today are so-called "pill doctors," men who advertise their practice by correspondence or otherwise and send to the patient by mail or express various compositions.

Ten Arrests at Chicago.
