

BOISE HIGH WINS FROM VALE TEAM AT BASKETBALL

Locals Start Season With Victory Over Oregonians by Decisive Score—Good Team Work Tells Story.

In the first game of the season the Boise high school basketball team won from Vale, Ore., by a score of 37 to 18. The visiting squad was completely outclassed by the uniform team work of the Boise players. The game was fast and Boise held Vale to but four field baskets. About 350 people turned out to see the game.

Boise held the upper hand from the beginning, having 21 points at the end of the first half. Vale secured no field baskets during the first half but made six points on foul baskets. However, during the second half Vale made a better showing and shot four field and four foul baskets. Boise made seven field baskets and two foul baskets, bringing the final score of the game up to 37 to 18 in Boise's favor.

Boise's team played a better game than had been expected. Ward Wyman and Paul Reynolds were Boise's stars, while the two Ellis brothers were Vale's best players.


