

# EX-GOVERNOR A CANDIDATE TO SUCCEED BORAH

Frank R. Gooding Says He Will Enter the Race Now That Senior Senator Is to Retire.

IF IN FIELD WOULD GIVE HIM SUPPORT

Formal Announcement, Together With His Platform, to Be Given the Public Later—Tribute Paid to Retiring Solon.

Former Governor Frank R. Gooding, who was in the city Thursday, made it known to some of his friends that he intended to enter the race for the United States senatorship to succeed Senator Borah, who has announced his retirement on the expiration of his term, March 4, 1919.

Last night when seen by a representative of the Capital News Mr. Gooding said: "Yes, it is true that I have told some of my friends here that I intended to announce my candidacy for the senatorship."

WOULD HAVE SUPPORTED BORAH.

"Had Senator Borah been a candidate for re-election I would have given him my most loyal support. With the field open, I have decided to enter it as a Republican candidate. I will make a formal announcement later and give the people the platform on which I will ask their support."

## FORMER BOISE BOY KILLED BY ENEMY BULLET

Andrew Thomson, of the Seventy-second Canadian Highlanders, Gives Up His Life to the Cause of Freedom.

PARENTS PROUD HE DID HIS BIT IN WAR

"God's Will Be Done" Writes Stricken Father to A. F. Graves of Boise in Telling of the Sacrifice He Has Made.

"We are proud that he did his bit!" The above was the patriotic utterance of Rev. Charles Thomson of Tacoma, former pastor of the Presbyterian church at Wendell, when announcing to A. F. Graves, well known real estate and insurance man of this city, the death of his son, Andrew Thomson, "somewhere in France."

Andrew Thomson will be remembered by many in Boise, Caldwell and Wendell. Two years ago he was in this state. While the Arrowrock dam was in course of construction he made his headquarters there, assisting Mr. Graves in his contract work. He attended the College of Idaho at Caldwell, and to pay his way through school acted as night clerk in the Saratoga hotel. The war in Europe attracted him and like many other Americans he enlisted in Canada and went to the front as a member of Company D, Seventy-second battalion, Canadian Highlanders.

FATHER AND SON CHUMS. Mr. Graves received notification of Thomson's death from his father, who said in part in his letter: "Our beloved Andrew gave up his precious life in the cause of righteousness, justice and freedom last Thursday."

Andrew was my best friend. We chummed as few fathers and sons do. The earthly life, seems pretty empty to me today. But God's will be done. We are proud that he did his bit."

Andrew Thomson was born in China, where his father was for years engaged in missionary work. He was popular among those who knew him best, and the announcement of his death will cause sorrow among his friends and acquaintances in this state.
