

PETITIONS TO JOIN THE GUARD VERY NUMEROUS

Adjutant General of State Asked by Many Cities for Places in Battalion.

When Definite Information Is Received From Department of Militia Information Will Go to Press—Could Organize Five.

Until Adjutant General C. S. Moody hears from department of militia at Washington nothing definite can be said with regard to the organization of the companies of national guard within the state of Idaho and the various cities and towns in the state petitioning for representation and asking they be given a place in the guard should not become impatient if they do not hear from his department.

"I am being petitioned from all parts of the state for companies," said General Moody. "Until I can hear from the Washington authorities, nothing can be said as to what action will be taken. Those who have petitioned will be notified through the press of the state promptly when the department of militia does take action. On the face of the petitions I could organize five more regiments in Idaho."

INTENSE ENTHUSIASM.

The petitions received are testimonial of the fact that there is the keenest possible interest in all parts of the state over the organization of the new national guard and intense enthusiasm. Governor Alexander requested the organization of a battalion some time ago following receipt of an official communication that national guard companies could be organized and that men eligible for draft could join such companies.

There will be 400 men in the battalion and it is probable they will be equipped by the government. This battalion will be made up of at least four, if not more, companies. Owing to the fact that the members of the guard will be used in various parts of the state to curb internal troubles it is likely that the companies will be geographically located so that they may be quickly moved from one part of the state to the other. It is probable that there may be more than four companies allowed.

DUTIES WITHIN STATE.

Due to the uncertainty as to just what obligations those joining the guard may have to take, there has been some hesitation on the part of many who would like to join home guard companies to become members. So far as is known up to the present time they will confine their military duties to the state alone and will not be obligated to move outside of its borders. More specific instruction will probably be received by the adjacent general later.

TO ABSOLVE STATE FROM CONNECTION ONEIDA DISTRICT

Land Board Asks Attorney General to Report on the Legal Steps Necessary—To Protect Settlers.

Attorney General T. A. Walters has been asked by the state land board to prepare a report as to the legal steps necessary to absolve the state from any connection with the Oneida Irrigation district and at the same time protect the settlers who have purchased the land. On this project the state paid \$31,000 to the district, or the amount water maintenance. Later the project was virtually abandoned owing to insufficiency of water, but recently a plan was made to revive it and this plan was taken up with the board. The latter desires, in the event the new district is formed and the plans go through, to have the amount it has already paid out pro-rated to the credit of the state land within the district.

The minutes of the land board covering this and other matters follows: Boise, Idaho, Dec. 21, 1917. State board of land commissioners of the state of Idaho met this day in regular session. The following members were present: M. Alexander, governor and chairman; W. T. Dougherty, secretary of state; C. Van Deusen, state auditor; J. A. Smoot, land commissioner; M. C. Stott, register.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit: Minutes of the previous meeting read and approved. Motion was made by the state auditor that the land commissioner be instructed to offer for sale all of the land owned by the state in township 5 north, range 42 east, and this will be the only state land sold in Madison county during the year 1918. The land commissioner to be instructed to appraise the land at an early date as possible and report to this board. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by the secretary of state that lease No. 5899, in the name of Cadet Anxo be cancelled. Motion carried unanimously.

R. C. Taylor appeared before the land board in relation to his application to lease land for grazing purposes and Dec. 24 was the date set for hearing this matter.

Motion was made and carried that the land commissioner be directed to remove the wire rope from King Hill project and bring it to Boise.

Letter of M. H. Woods, in relation to payments on water contracts of Blaine County Investment company, was referred to the land commissioner for investigation and report, and the register was directed to secure a copy of new contract between the company and the settlers.

Report of W. C. Mann, forest supervisor, was referred to Land Commissioner Smoot for approval.

CONSIDER ONEIDA DISTRICT. Motion was made by the state auditor that in view of the fact that P. A. Montague has paid taxes on land covered by certificate of sale No. 4492, that previous order of the board ordering cancellation of this certificate be revoked, in so far as the payment of taxes is concerned.

Motion was made and duly carried that the state treasurer be directed to secure from the bank the bonds of second liberty loan issue and report to the board the amount of bonds received.

Motion was made by Governor Alexander, and unanimously carried, that the state engineer be requested to assist the Mountain View Canal company, whose post office address is P. C. Williams, Box 412, Dubois, Idaho, and that he lend them such assistance as is consistent with the dignity of the state, without expense.
