ALL COUNTIES TO REPORT ON "WHITE LISTS"

Names of Merchants Who Agree to the Cash and Carry Plan Being Given Food Administrator.

Bear Lake County First to Report, with Practically Every Groceryman in the Agreement—All "Glad to Come In."

Food Administrator R. F. Bicknell has called upon all Idaho county chairmen of the food administration to furnish him with the names of the merchants, in their respective counties who will go upon the "cash and carry" basis Jan. 1 or thereafter, in order that he may publish "white lists" of such merchants calling upon patriotic citizens of the various communities to take their patronage to them.

Bear Lake county is the first to be heard from and practically every merchant of the county, a number of whom do not even handle groceries "were glad to come in," states William J. Crockett of the firm of F. C. Hansen and company of Montpelier, who reported the action of the merchants Wednesday to the food administration. The merchants of Bear Lake county entered into the following agreement: "In accordance with the wishes of the United States food administrator, all merchants throughout the land are asked to go on a cash basis and eliminate the delivery system.

"We, the merchants of Bear Lake county, Idaho, feel it our patriotic duty to comply with the request of our government; therefore, beginning the first day of January, 1918, we will adopt the cash and carry plan and sell for cash only. No delivery."

URGE APPOINTMENT OF VANSICKLIN TO STATE COMMISSION

Good Road Advocates of North Idaho Pass Resolutions—Weiser Man Likely to Be Named.

Declaring in resolutions adopted that the present state highway commission has in all ways and at all times acted with an eye single to the betterment of the highway system, the good roads enthusiasts of Shoshone county have adopted resolutions declaring in favor of the reappointment of E. A. Van Sicklin a member of the commission when his term expires the first of the new year. A copy of the resolution was forwarded to Governor Alexander. The north Idaho good roads enthusiasts claim there have been influences at work in an attempt to divert funds appropriated for construction work on the highway in the Fourth of July canyon, and used otherwise, this influence being of a northern origin. The legislature appropriated the funds for this specific purpose and the backers of the canyon road want to see it so used.

It is said to be more than likely that the governor will reappoint VanSicklin on the state highway commission. The following is a copy of the resolution passed by the road enthusiasts at a meeting at Wallace:

RESOLUTION PASSED. Whereas, the legislature of the state of Idaho regularly assembled in the Fourteenth session did appropriate a certain fund for the construction of good roads, and did specifically appropriate these funds to certain specified districts, and

Whereas, it is reported that there are influences at work to the end that funds appropriated for the improvement of the north and south highway and that portion of the Yellowstone trail known as the Fourth of July canyon road, be diverted and otherwise used, and

Whereas, the majority of the present highway commission is opposed to such misappropriation of public funds and is committed to a policy of redeeming the pledges made by the legislature, and

Whereas, the present commission has in all ways and at all times acted with an eye single to the betterment of our highway system, regardless of ulterior influences, and

Whereas, the term of E. A. Van Sicklin, one of the members of the commission, is about to expire, and

Whereas, the commission as at present constituted holds the confidence of the people in every part of the state, and

Whereas, any change at this time would only hinder and delay the work already started; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that in order that the good roads movement be kept free
