

WHISKY WILL NOT BE USED AGAINST ENEMIES OF U. S.

Government Decides Alcohol From Bootleg Article, Will Be Too Impure for Making Powder.

Idaho's bootleg whisky will not be used with powder and shells to shoot at the Germans. The ordinance department at Washington has decided otherwise. In fact it must meet the same fate of thousands of gallons of perfectly good firewater which have been poured into the gutter since Idaho passed under the portals of a late-wide prohibition. The government had intended to collect the storage supply in the hands of sheriffs, distill it and use the alcohol for making powder. At the special request of the department the governor's office took an invoice of the stock of bootleg liquors on hand, as held by sheriffs, police courts and justices of peace. It located some thousands of gallons and so reported to the war department.

GOVERNMENT CHANGES MIND. The following letter was received by Governor Alexander from Major Douglas McVay, of the ordnance department, Washington, D. C., saying in part: "Consideration has been given to the subject of rectification of seized liquors for the purpose of converting them into alcohol of suitable proof for use in powder manufacture. Some of the problems involved are transportation, impurities, redistillation and reproofing, together with percentage of yield, probably in the neighborhood of 37 per cent. Consideration of these factors does not lead to the conclusion that recovery of suitable spirits-free from harmful impurities and of feasible proof quality for powder manufacture is practicable under the circumstances."

Sheriffs of the various counties and other officials will be notified of the decision of the government not to make use of the intoxicants.
