

LEAGUE OF NATION RESOLUTION KILLED

House of Representative Today Takes Significant Action In Indefinitely Postponing the Measure.

The house of representatives today killed the league of nations measure known as house concurrent resolution No. 1, by Peckham. It was referred, after introduction, to the state affairs committee. This committee reported that the measure be indefinitely postponed. The house adopted the report without opposition.

SAYS SHIPYARD STRIKE WAS CAUSED BY THE HIGH COST OF LIVING ON COAST

R. M. Sargent, 1502 North Twenty-first street, this city, returned home Sunday from Tacoma, after having put in time from May 11, 1918, in one of the huge shipyards at that place. Mr. Sargent went to Tacoma as a carpenter, but later on worked as an asbestos worker. He states that the fabrication of wooden ships in the Pacific coast yards is practically at a standstill, and that no more will be built as soon as those on the ways at present are completed.


MERIDIAN RAISES ITS ARMENIAN RELIEF QUOTA IN EXACTLY ONE MEETING

Dr. S. J. Krikorian addressed the gathering at Meridian, and pictured to them the needs of those children in foreign lands who were crying for bread and clothing. He described the tortures the race had been subjected to, and told how they had been persecuted and when he had finished the quota was raised in a jiffy. Dr. Krikorian will deliver two four-minute talks on the Armenian situation and the necessity for immediate relief of the sufferers tonight at the Majestic and Strand theaters, and all are urged to make a special effort to attend as his lecture is not only elevating but educational. Captain McCracken made a short talk which was well received, and then introduced Dr. Krikorian, the speaker of the evening.

FAST WRESTLING BOUT FOR THURSDAY NIGHT

'Babe' Brown and Charley Olsen, Swedish Champion, Will Tangle in Finish Match at Isis Theater.

'Babe' Brown, who will undertake to throw Charley Olsen, of Chicago, at the Isis theater Thursday night, January 29, began his work yesterday at the gym of Nick Collins, and will shortly be in perfect trim. Olsen will work at the Central fire station and also at Nick Collins' gymnasium, and began his conditioning work today.

Both boys are very evenly matched as regards weight, though Olsen has had the benefit of more mat experience than has 'Babe,' having been in the game for years in this country and Sweden. At Nampa, he wrestled 'Cyclone' Workman, the fast boy from that town, and was thrown twice in 35 minutes by him. This should not be allowed to detract from his worth in one whit, as Olsen wrestled with a knee that was swollen all out of shape and gave him no service whatever and much weakening pain all through the match.

Both boys are shifty with Olsen probably the faster, though 'Babe' is no slouch when it comes to moving around the mat. They are about the same build—heavy from the waist up with sturdy legs—and it should be 50-50 with them from start to finish, with the odds slightly in favor of Olsen by reason of more mat experience, though
