

# MORA DISTRICT WANT HILL-CREST LANDS IRRIGATED

Object to Black Canyon Project Being Given the Preference When Lands Nearer Can Be Reclaimed More Easily.

## SEND LETTER TO NUGENT

Urge That Funds Be Distributed to Hill-Crest as Next Unit—May Send Representative to Washington to Push Claim

The Boise-Mora irrigation district objects to the Black Canyon irrigation project being given preference over the Hill-Crest extension to the Boise project, and makes its stand plain in this regard in a letter to United States Senator John F. Nugent. A copy of this is in the hands of the commercial club. If it is found necessary the club will send a representative to Washington to push its claims. The letter says in part:

"We noticed by recent press dispatches that yourself and Senator Borah are attempting to secure a distribution of reclamation funds for the Black Canyon project.

"As the dispatch does not go into detail, we are wondering for just what purpose this distribution is to be used, because if it is to be used to start any new units of the Black Canyon project, we cannot help but believe that it is decidedly unfair, in view of the fact that a distribution of last year's funds were made to complete one unit of that project, to which we offered no strenuous objections, because it was shown to us that the unit of Black Canyon project provided for, was of such nature that it could be watered with waste water at a nominal expense and would give quick returns which were sorely needed in time of war; also that it would not require any additional canal capacity or increased use of Arrowrock storage, but this cannot be said about any further units of the Black Canyon and further, the Hill-Crest and Black Canyon extensions were recommended practically as one proposition, and we feel that no further extensions should be made to the Black Canyon until at least one unit of the Hill-Crest is provided for.

### HILL-CREST NEARER.

"We understand there is some doubt in the minds of the reclamation service as to whether there is sufficient water for all the Hill-Crest and Black Canyon lands, and if this be the case, it would certainly be unwise to carry water 20 miles to Black Canyon, with all the associated water losses, and leave a better body of land unwatered right at Arrowrock reservoir, which body of land has no other source of water supply, whereas the Black Canyon can be watered from the Payette river, with possibly less expense and a sufficient and surer supply of water.

"We are at liberty to say to you that the water users' association, which represent the largest number of settlers under the present Boise project, will no doubt go on record as opposed to watering any lands on the north side of the Boise river until all available lands immediately adjacent to the present project, and particularly those close to the point of diversion, are watered if it should prove there is sufficient water in Arrowrock for any additional lands.

"The record of the water users' association, however, show that at one time they expressed themselves in favor of the Black Canyon, because it was held out to them that to bring the Black Canyon lands within the Boise project, would reduce the cost of water to other settlers under the project, but as this has since been proven untrue, a change of attitude has taken place and these people now favor using the water on the Hill-Crest extension and other lands on the south side of the Boise river, because it would be more economical and give better satisfaction to all concerned.

**MAY SEND REPRESENTATIVE.**  
"There is a suit at present pending in the district court, which will come on for hearing the coming week, in which the question of water supply from Arrowrock reservoir will be heard, which will be a factor in our decision to push vigorously our claim for funds, and immediately upon decision of the court, we will send a representative to Washington to present our matter, if it cannot be arranged otherwise, with a view of insisting that if there is any funds available for extension work or new work, that the Hill-Crest extension be taken up as the next extension to the Boise project.

"We trust, however, that yourself, Congressman Smith and Senator Borah will present our matter firmly to the reclamation service and secure for us a favorable action, without necessitating the great expense of sending our representative to Washington.

## THIRD NURSE LETTER PENNEDED WAR-END DAY

Missive From Young Boise  
Lieutenant to Parents Here  
Written With a German Pen  
—French Expected End.

The third letter of Lieutenant Robert L. Nourse to his parents in this city was written on the day the armistice was signed, and proves beyond a doubt that the fighting men knew that Marshal Foch had the Boches in a trap and that they would not last much longer, as he mentions that they expected Germany will ask for peace.

"Nov. 11. \* \* \* This is the initial effort of a new pen, a Boche pen, which I purchased for four francs in a store in L. I do not expect much of a 'romance' in view of its low price, but it was not a question of economy so much as lack of choice. The storekeeper was very happy to sell it to me. She was rather 'fed up' on Boches and everything pertaining to Boches. Small wonder, after four years under their yoke.

"We have moved since my last letter. Our move was towards Germany—but so fast are the Germans retreating at the present moment that, in spite of the fact that we are half-way from the old lines to the border, we are farther behind the advancing French first lines than we have ever been before.

"These are historic days. It is now Nov. 11, and we expect the armistice to be signed today. I have no doubt but that long after this generation and the next are laid away, harassed school children of the epoch will be memorizing the date "Nov. 11, 1918," along with "1492" and those other hughenars of youth.

"The Boche emissaries are now on French soil and have no doubt learned the worst as I write. I should not like to be a Boche emissary at the present moment. An armistice is certainly due within the present week and peace is certainly coming before many months have passed. I am naturally hoping that we will be sent home soon afterward, but I am not building my hopes too high.

"There is the occupation of Germany to be arranged, and, of course, we have the possibility of having to go on and civilize Russia. However, we must accept what comes. It is wonderful enough that the war should finish, as it is in the process of doing now, without ravaging concerning our own little destinies.

**FRANCE VERY INTERESTING.**  
"I find it very interesting to be up in this part of France, where the French flag has not flown for four years. As you know, I am somewhat of a sight-seer by nature and take great delight in explorations. We are, at present, camped in a pretty little town about 30 miles on the German side of the old Hindenburg line, and an equal distance from the frontier. It was once well in the German rear, as is evinced by the integrity of the houses and the nature of the Boche installations.

"We are evacuating wounded from what was a Boche vase hospital. The French have taken it over as it stood, and are even using the same instru-

ments in the analytical laboratory, the same cots for the patients and the same office.

"In an adjoining building the Boche had installed a military map factory and in the storeroom are thousands of maps of all parts of France. These are printed in German but can easily be used by anyone. I collected a few as souvenirs. I am collecting a lot of junk or 'souvenirs'—have been since the beginning, but I am fearing now that I may never get the major part of it home.

"We have taken over a Boche machine shop, with a scientific shed, under which all of our 24 cars are sheltered when not in use. My office is the former office of a Boche quartermaster general. My private room was a German captain's 'bondoir' in the merry old days, before Germany was kicked out of her place in the sun. I am using this captain's lamp, which is really marvelous, despite its Leipsic origin.

"I have stumbled on a large assortment of Boche propaganda 'dope' in the form of leaflets, which they planned to drop in the French lines by aeroplanes. They were never dropped into French hands, because the aeroplanes, its hangar and the boxes, yet unopened, were captured before the aeroplanes ever left the ground, by the rapidly advancing French.

"It is very amusing to read the things the Boche says on these leaflets. I hope to bring back to Boise some day a quantity of these interesting propaganda.

"I am enclosing some Boche paper money which has been the current specie in occupied France for four years. It was given me in change when I bought the pen.

"No news from Norman. In an advance like this, in which we have taken part, the main problem is the getting up supplies. The mail must wait. We have had no letters for a long time—but undoubtedly when it does come we will be crushed under its accumulated weight. \* \* \*"
