

TEXAS OIL WELLS ATTRACTING MANY

Captain Shellworth, After Inspecting Fields of Lone Star State, Says It Is Destined to Be Largest Oil Producer.

Captain Julius F. Shellworth, who recently returned from a 15-day trip to his old home, Texas, declared this morning that the Lone Star state is destined to become the world's greatest oil producing region, and that golden opportunities exist on all sides for men who will work as the greatest oil field ever known has been merely scratched as yet.

Captain Shellworth has been interested in Comanche, Comanche county, Texas, for some time, many of his relatives living there. Up to a few months ago Comanche was not very well known outside of Texas. Today, it is on the tongues of every man, woman and child in the south, and is being recognized the world over as the home of the world's greatest oil deposits. The first well was discovered there by mistake. A company was drilling for water in sand formations, and left the drill at night to go home. In the morning they found they had a gushing oil well that was worth hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Today the oil fields cover 14 counties. Gas has been found in great quantities, one gas well producing 62,000,000 cubic feet every 24 hours. In Fort Worth now everything is done with gas; the average cost per month of gas for cooking, lighting and heating purposes being only 35.

Fort Worth, formerly a great cattle city and center, is today the world's greatest oil center, he says. Already over 40 refineries are in process of construction in that city. That the city is progressive and has a bright future is evidenced by the fact that it recently raised \$2,000,000 for a huge hotel in just 10 days.

"No matter where you go in Fort Worth," said Captain Shellworth, "buildings are going up. In the immediate neighborhood of my sister-in-law's home, there were 20 buildings in process of construction. As usual, when a boom is on, rents are high. A cottage four miles from the Union depot rents for approximately \$40 a month."

According to Captain Shellworth the oil strike is not a wildcat proposition, but solid in every way. Buildings being built in new oil towns are of brick or stone, bulid permanently, while towns are being paved with the finest sewer and water systems being installed that can be found. Captain Shellworth, while in Texas with his son, personally inspected many of the large wells and oil districts open for the sale of stock, and invested in several as every indication pointed to oil being found more readily than water which is easily secured at a depth of 20 feet in that country. The climate and weather was ideal while they were there.
