FIND BABY IN SUITCASE. The body of a new born baby boy, crammed into an old suitcase, was found by school children in Canyon creek near the old fallings dam above town.

BIG CELEBRATION JULY FOURTH. At a meeting of the business men of this city called by J. H. Heckathorn, president of the chamber of commerce, it was voted to hold a monster celebration here July Fourth and at the same time to welcome home all Latah county soldiers and sailors.

FLU REPEATS IN BEAR LAKE. Like a bolt from the sky the influenza fell upon us the latter part of last week, and in 36 hours had spread to about 50 homes in the city. It was all the more surprising because it had been absent for about six weeks and all business and social and religious activities were in full swing again.

BIG INCOME FROM BEETS. Clearing more than \$1500 from 11 acres of sugar beets is the record of George F. Peterson of Twin Falls, for the last season. It is a mark at which growers may shoot for some time to come.

TO IMPROVE STATE PARK. The first gun in a financial campaign for the Shoshone Falls Memorial park is fired by C. D. Thomas, member of the park campaign committee, who has picked 1000 men who will be asked to subscribe not less than \$100 and as much more as they wish.

ALL SETTLERS DEFENDANTS. That the petition of the plaintiffs in the case of Robert Rayl, et al. vs. the Twin Falls Land and Water company is allowed to stand, by order of the United States district court at Pocatello, is the substance of a notice just received by attorney in the case, which involves the validity of liens under water contracts.

In the order, which excepts only paragraphs five and six of the petition, these relating to deeded holdings, the court requires the plaintiffs, represented by Judge Bothwell, and the defendants, who are the bondholders and the company, to file answers to the petition within 20 days from March 12.

Weyerhousers to Build Road. A crew of surveyors left Greer for the Pierce section and are presumably in the employ of the Weyerhouser timber syndicate. This information was brought to the city yesterday by James McCullough, who with Mrs. McCullough arrived from their home at Fraser to visit here for two weeks with their daughter.

Mr. McCullough, who is a pioneer of the Fraser section, where he owns valuable farm lands, is noting with interest the movements which seem to indicate an early opening of the vast Clearwater timber belt.

Italy Welded by Hammer Blows of War



Italy as it was before unification took place under the House of Savoy, the duchy itself being ceded to France in return for her assistance. Territory in black shows what Italy hopes to gain as a result of her participation in the world war.

Rome, March 26.—The decision of the statesmen at Versailles to award Trentino and certain other territory formerly under Austro-Hungarian domination to Italy means that the Italian-speaking race is at last to be united.

The Italy with which the younger generation of these times has been familiar is of comparatively recent growth. Only some 50 to 60 years ago matters were very different from what they are today, and at the beginning of the last century Italy presented the extraordinary picture of a number of separate states, "only a geographical expression," as it was contemptuously termed by Metternich, the archpriest of reaction in Europe during the early 19th century.

NAPOLION CONQUERS ITALY. This state of things was ended by the war of the French revolution. The moribund republics of Venice and Genoa were destroyed forever, and by 1806 all Italy, except the islands of Sicily and Sardinia, was under the rule of Napoleon.

U. S. ARMY CAMPS TO BE PLACED ON BLOCK

Bids on 13 Cantonments to Be Received on April 15; Everything but the Land to be Sold

Washington, March 26.—The war department will, on April 15, receive bids on 13 army camps, according to the Chamber of Commerce of the United States today.

The camps to be sold to the highest bidder are:

Beauregard, Bowie, Colt, Hancock, Hendrick, Logan, Polk, Sevier, North Camp Jackson, Shelby, Sheridan, Wadsworth and Wheeler.

The department will sell all buildings and the bidder must in his bid include all barracks, railroads, storehouses, bridges, sewage and water supply systems. The land cannot be sold at these camps for the government has leased it for the period of the emergency it was stated. While all buildings are included in the bid, the government reserves the right to retain all base hospitals and remount stations.

TO NAME SUPERVISORS FOR '20 CENSUS JULY 1

Washington, March 26.—One hundred supervisors to direct the taking of the 1920 census as of January 1 will be named by the commerce department about July 1. Census Director Rogers announced today.

Rogers warned persons hoping for jobs as local enumerators not to write the department, but to wait until supervisors are appointed and then to apply to them in writing. Supervisors will hire local enumerators, he said.

Local enumerators will be paid on a per capita basis, and will be required to take a practical examination, which will include filling out a sample census form.

Supervisors will draw \$1500 for approximately seven months' work, plus \$1 for each 1000 persons enumerated. They also will be required to take examinations.
