

NINE CHILDREN SEE CIVILIZATION FOR FIRST TIME TODAY

Homeless Babies Brought to Boise From South Fork Salmon Thought Warrens a Metropolis.

Nine little children, some of whom had never even seen a wagon, much less the marvels of a wonderful little city like Boise, were brought out of the Warrens district Wednesday, by Mrs. Thera J. Wayland, Valley county school superintendent and probation officer, and taken to the Children's home, where they will be schooled and fed and will have an opportunity to catch up with civilization into which they have been suddenly thrust.

BABE 4 MONTHS OLD.
The oldest of the children is a girl about 14 and the youngest is a baby but four months old. Their mother is dead, and their father was unable to look after them. Mrs. Wayland, learning of the situation, went to the house, bundled up the little ones and brought them to town. Their family name is Fritter.

The mother died when the baby was but four weeks old, a young woman. Because of their poverty the children have had a hard life, it is said. None of them, not even the 14-year-old girl, have ever been to school.

THEIR "BIG TOWN."
The idea of a big town to the children was the settlement of Warrens. They lived about three miles away, on the south fork of the Salmon.

They are supposed to have an uncle at Grimes' Pass, but Mrs. Wayland has been unable to get in touch with him. Mrs. Wayland brought another baby from McCall to the Children's home, making ten in her party.


