GOVERNOR DAVIS TO HEAD BIG CONGRESS

Western States Ask Idaho Official to Preside at Big Irrigation Meeting at Salt Lake Nov. 21-22.

States which have become interested in the irrigation congress called by Governor Davis for Nov. 21-22 at Salt Lake for the adoption of a representative irrigation policy for western states and to consider mutual irrigation problems of both administration and legislation, have requested that Governor Davis act as chairman of the conference, according to Frank W. Brown, the governor's private secretary.

Governor Davis has asked each of the western states to name a member of a finance and of a resolution committee to meet the day before the congress at Salt Lake and consider plans for making the organization permanent.

at the Mormon tabernacle at noon and a luncheon at the Hotel Utah at 1 o'clock on Nov. 21. Governor Davis said today: "It is our hope to solidify the efforts of the intermountain irrigation states by getting representative men together for the purpose of forming a reclamation association which will represent in a broad way the millions of people whose contributions to the wealth of the country are largely founded on the reclaiming of lands so that they may produce this wealth."

LITTLE CONCERNED ACTION "In the past, while there has always been the same principle as a guiding light for the different states, there has been little concerted action. All of us are deeply grateful for the great constructive work of the Department of Reclamation, but they have had little help from us in their efforts to get financial assistance from Congress, and I believe that all these great elements—the people of the west, the federal departments and the legislative unit of the country should be working together to stimulate production and avoid the waste of water."

"Never before have the people of Idaho been so deeply interested in reclamation as they are today. Our local state association has had much to do with this, stimulating thought and arousing action. This can be increased twelve fold by the organization spreading over the states of the west, and we should establish a fixed policy to be passed upon by congress that will make possible the utilization of all the lands of agricultural value in the west."
