

COUNTY SURVEYOR B. F. FARMER DIES OF HEART DISEASE

Malheur County Official Is Stricken While Performing Duties Constructing Bridge Over Dry Creek Near Vale.

(Capital News Special Service.) Vale, Nov. 26.—Every part of Malheur county was shocked over the sudden death Monday evening of B. F. Farmer, the well-known and highly esteemed county surveyor of this county. Mr. Farmer, who died of heart failure, literally died in the harness. When death overtook him he was in the act of supervising the construction of a large bridge being built by the county over Dry creek, 30 miles south of Vale. He rode out on a truck apparently in his usual good health and spirits. His body was brought to Vale in the same truck, arriving here at midnight Monday. Mrs. Farmer, his only immediate survivor, is prostrated with grief.

Mr. Farmer was 65 years old. He was a leading member of the Baptist church and was a prominent Mason. He was a very active church and lodge worker. The Masonic lodge will have charge of the funeral services. Mr. Farmer lived in Nyssa five years before coming to Vale, five years ago. His duties as county surveyor were arduous because of the extensive system of good roads and bridges being constructed in this county. He was an authority on engineering and has assisted in many of the big engineering enterprises in the west. One of the big jobs he engineered was the construction of the Western Pacific railroad, which furnished many difficult engineering problems.

HAS FINE SUCCESS FEEDING CATTLE ON HIS NYSSA RANCH

(Capital News Special Service.) Nyssa, Nov. 26.—Eight hundred and fifty cattle are being fed for beef by W. G. Cathey. Nyssa's well known rancher and stockman. Of this number 400 belong to Mr. Cathey and 400 are the property of A. G. Huntley, cattlemen of Idaho, whose big ranch is northwest of Council. Mr. Huntley's cattle arrived here yesterday from Council and put on Mr. Cathey's feed lots which are among the best and most conveniently located in eastern Oregon. There are more than 100 calves on the Cathey farm.

It will require fully 1700 tons of alfalfa and 425 tons of ensilage to feed the 850 cattle. Mr. Cathey stated it will take an average of two tons of alfalfa and half a ton of ensilage to feed out each of them. Mr. Cathey has an alfalfa meal mill on the farm. Its capacity is 30 tons a day. There is absolutely no waste in feeding cattle on this place because all the alfalfa is ground into meal and fed in this form.

GAIN WEIGHT RAPIDLY. That cattle prosper and gain weight rapidly when fed alfalfa meal has been fully demonstrated by Mr. Cathey. For instance, 108 cows were on the feed lots last year and they gained an average of 185 pounds each, or an average of 1.75 pounds per day and one-twelfth pounds per day per head. Some individual steers in a large herd fed by Mr. Cathey last year for beef made wonderful gains in weight. One of them gained 370 pounds, one 460 pounds, another a fraction over 500 pounds. The whole herd made an average gain that exceeded anything of the kind ever before witnessed in this section. These cattle were on the feed lots here for six months. There was one month that they made no gain in weight, due to cold, wet weather. They were fed only alfalfa meal. Mr. Cathey feels certain that the combination feed of alfalfa meal and ensilage will cause the cattle to gain faster in weight than when fed only on the meal.

NEW SEED CLEANING WORKS. J. H. Forbes just completed the installation of machinery for cleaning clover and alfalfa seed also grain, in the cement block building west of the O. S. L. depot. He opened the cleaning works today with a fine run of business.

ZINK BREAKS HIP. C. M. Zink Monday afternoon sustained a broken hip from a bad fall due to the breaking of a scaffold on which he and C. J. Ashcroft were working at the new house being built west of town by C. C. Hunt. Both men fell to the ground. Mr. Zink landed on his hip. Mr. Ashcroft landed on his feet, and escaped injury. George Green is completing a four-room brick house in the north part of town. The family of his daughter, Mrs. Glen Hanson, will occupy the house. Great is building a modern residence on the fine 40-acre tract he purchased of C. C. Hunt.

LOCAL GRANGES IN 21 STATES REPORT THEY WANT TOWNSEND BILL

Reports which have been received from local granges in 21 states in response to a letter sent out by the Washington representatives of the National Grange indicate that farm sentiment throughout the United States is overwhelmingly in favor of governmental participation in highway construction as advocated by the Townsend bill. In connection with this movement an interesting article written by Senator Townsend appeared in Service, a monthly magazine published by the Service Motor Truck company, Wash., Ind. In this article Senator Townsend points out that civilization is but the

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result of the growth of means of communication. "No individual or state," says the senator from Michigan, "can live satisfactorily in isolation. I believe that we ought to have a national system of roads. Let the states build the laterals, but let us have a system of national highways extending through every state east and west, north and south. It is of supreme importance that state and federal aid should be based on sound business economics. The state should build and maintain strictly state roads and the state highway authorities should be held to strict accountability for the expenditure of the state's money. Only trained men with practical engineering ability and experience should be placed in charge of this work. The real justification for public expenditure on highways is their promotion of civilization and the highest good for all the people."
