ASSESSED VALUE OF TWO MILLION

\$300,000 Street Building and Improvement Planned for This Year—Bond Election Probably in March.

CITY WORTH 20 MILLION

Valuation Back on Solid Basis—Local Levy of .015 Mills Will Raise \$277,500 as Compared \$218,000 Last Year.

The city of Boise, exclusive of the improvements going on upon the state property within its limits, made a clear gain of approximately \$1,000,000 during 1919 in assessed valuation.

The valuation of the city was found several years ago to be considerably inflated, and since that time there has been a steady decrease until last year it went to \$18,000,000, which was supposed to represent the actual 100 per cent value.

LEVY DIVISIONS

The levy this year is divided to raise \$204,961.50 for the general fund, \$32,256.50 for the road fund and the remainder for interest, sinking and library funds.

In 1919 only seven blocks of paving were put in, costing approximately \$25,000. In 1920 the plans are to do about \$300,000 worth of street improvement in the city, of which about \$70,000 will be raised through a bond issue.

The seven blocks improved by paving in 1919 were on the following streets: Two blocks on Eleventh street, between Bannock and State; two on Twelfth between Bannock and State; one and a half blocks on Eleventh between Borah and Front; one and a half on Thirteenth between Borah and Front.

BONDS FOR CROSSINGS

The 1920 program calls for finishing of proposed paving work and for other improvements and repairs on streets in all parts of the city. The \$70,000 bond issue will be used to raise funds for paving intersections.

Some of the increase in assessed valuation this year is accounted for by the fact that the state board of equalization raised valuations on public utilities. The value of the Bell Telephone company lines, for instance, were raised from \$28 per mile to \$60 per mile.


