## Cheering Crowds and a Great Street Parade

Minneapolis, Aug. 15.—For the 40th time since its work was finished and its glory won, the Grand Army of the Republic was in line today. There have been many parades, more gorgeous spectacles, more dazzling and bewildering, but never has there been in this country a more appealing and impressive one than that which passed through the streets during the greater part of this morning.

The Grand Army has often marched before; it will march again next year, and again the year after that; it will march until the members can march no more; and then it will commence its greatest march of all through time into eternity and into its ordained reward. Some small token of what this guerdon from posterity is to be was given the old soldiers who filled the ranks today.

They were made to realize that for the first time, at last, materialism was gone and the days of the heroes were come again. At times their ears were greeted by cheers that drowned the roar and crash of their bands—at times they passed through living lanes, where every tongue was still, every eye was dim and every head was bared in reverence for what they had suffered and wrought for the welfare of their fellowmen.

### Lost Wife and Children in Forest Fire.

Sandpoint, Aug. 16.—E. A. Shear found the body of a man floating down Pend d'Oreille river nearly opposite Wrenco on Monday. He tied it to the bank of the river and notified Undertaker Bower. The body was buried last night at the county's expense.

The body was shown to the book-keeper at Winter, Parson & Boomer's camp near Wrenco and he claims that

it is the body of a man well known around here as "Ole the Bum." Officer Moran also identified the remains as those of "Ole the Bum," or Frank Oleson.

This man has been a character around here. He has never been known to work except at Bonner's Ferry, when he worked at the Casey hotel for James Casey. After that he hung around the railroad camps and managed to get enough to eat. It is supposed he went in swimming near the camp and took cramps. When found the body was nude.

Oleson was 45 years old and had red hair and moustache. He is reported to have lost his mind several years ago when a forest fire destroyed the town of Hineckley, Minn., burning his family while he was away from home. He lost a wife and two children in the fire and since that time has been rather weak minded.

**Washing a Counterpane.**  
To wash a counterpane rub it well with soap and put it overnight in a tub of lukewarm water. The next morning wash it out of the water it was soaked in. Then wring out and wash in some clean soapuds, after which wash it through a second suds warmer than the first. Rinse it twice through plenty of cold water. The last rinse water should have a little blue in it. Wring the counterpane out and hang it in the sun to dry wrong side out. Take it in toward evening, and the next day hang it with the right side out. It must on no account be put away with the least dampness in it. Sometimes it takes three days to dry perfectly.
