COURSE OF LECTURES.

Baptists Are Securing Attractions for Winter.

STEAM ROLLER AT WORK.

Macadamizing Sherman Street --Good Work.

The work of Macadamizing Sherman street is on in earnest. The roller is kept busy rolling the street and leveling it preparatory to the first covering of crushed stone, which is being placed today. This covering is of large sized stone which is rolled into the sandy soil to produce a good foundation. Later another layer of finer stone will be placed and this receive the same treatment as the first. The third coating will be made with rock crushed the fineness of gravel and when the work is completed this will have been rolled until the entire mass of rock has the hardness of a concrete wall. The depth of his covering will vary, as the grade is not correct, and where the difference is slight, stone will be used as a filler.
