

EARTHQUAKES HAVE CEASED

Loss of Life and Property Is Very Great

New York, Aug. 21.—Advices show that the earthquakes in Chile have ceased and the fires have been extinguished and people of the two cities, Valparaiso and Santiago, are taking organized steps to relieve suffering, care for the wounded and bury the dead. The period of suocor has entered. Dispatches received from Chile today tend to show that the first estimates of casualties and material damage had been greatly exaggerated, and that the people of Valparaiso are becoming calmer. The fear of further shocks has been removed by a statement issued from the observatory, and today it became possible for the first time to organize relief work and begin a systematic search of the ruins for the dead.

Santiago is coming to the rescue of her suffering sister. Public subscriptions have been opened for money, clothing and provisions, and the capital is coming for all refugees from Valparaiso who make their way across the mountains.

The government is putting down pillage wherever it breaks out with troops. It is still impossible to reach correct estimates of the dead and injured. The reports from Chile are most conflicting. A large section of the country, however, was visited by the catastrophe of last Thursday, and cabled estimates of casualties refer in some instances to particular localities, notably Valparaiso, and in others evidently to the entire district which suffered from the shocks. The number of dead in Valparaiso doubtless runs into the hundreds and for the country probably into the thousands. The property damage is estimated from \$200,000,000 to \$300,000,000.

Busy Laying New Line.

The Boise & Interurban people are now busy on their cut-off by which the line is to be connected with the Oregon Short Line, says the Idaho Statesman. This connection will be made at Twenty-eighth street. Down the valley they are moving fences back and clearing the right-of-way, and everything is progressing rapidly. It is the purpose to make the roadbed perfect so cars can be run at high speed and without dust. The roadway will be sprinkled with oil or water to insure perfect conditions. As the rails are heavy and the road straight, high speed can be maintained. On the Spokane-Coeur d'Alene line the distance, 34 miles, is covered by some trains in an hour. That includes one regular stop, two stops for railway crossings and stops in town. Sometimes the trip is made in less time.

On the Boise & Interurban equally good time can be made, the trip from there to Cadwell being made easily in an hour including all stops. There will be no dust and no cinders, and on the warmest day all the windows can be kept open without inviting discomfort.

People here do not yet realize just

what this railway will be for the Boise and Payette valleys when it is completed, but they will quickly recognize its advantages when the cars get to running.

REPORT ON LIQUOR LICENSES

The clerk communicate with the different cities in regard to the charge for license. The motion was carried. The resignation of P. F. McGovern as city marshal, was received and accepted.

A petition signed by the majority of the business men of the city, asking that an additional night watchman be appointed was received, and placed on file. Owing to the scarcity of funds, the matter will be investigated.

An application for the office of city marshal signed by Geo. Ott, was received and placed on file. A petition requesting that Michael Roche be given a position on the police force, signed by numerous men was received, and placed on file. It was accompanied by several recommendations.

The report of the village marshal and the justice of the peace were found correct and placed on file.

Attorney Sander reported on the Lanier license and stated that the board could not arbitrarily refuse the license unless he had been guilty of conducting a disorderly place or if he was not of good moral character. It developed that it was not necessary for the matter to come before the council. Mr. Harte stated that he was responsible for the matter coming before the board, on the grounds that he thought it necessary for the case to receive the consideration of the board.

Chas. Young moved that the license be granted to J. P. Lanier.

Attorney Sanders after reading the ordinance on this question stated the matter was in the hands of the city fathers.

Mr. Varman stated that he was not in favor of granting the license.

Mr. Andrew moved that it was the opinion of the board that it was not desirable to grant further saloon license on Sherman street between Third and Fourth street.

Mayor Collins objected to acting on the matter until all the members of the board were present; and the meeting was adjourned until this evening.
