DATES SET FOR COURT TERMS

In the District Court of the Sixth Judicial District of the State of Idaho.
 Under and by virtue of authority in me vested by the statutes of Idaho, I hereby fix the terms of court for the Sixth Judicial District of the State of Idaho, for the year 1918, to commence and be held in the counties of said District, as follows, to-wit:
 Bingham county: February 11th; June 10th; November 25th.
 Butte county: March 25th; November 11th.
 Custer county: March 4th; October 21st.
 Lemhi county: January 29th; May 25th; September 30th.
 Said terms of court to convene at ten o'clock a. m., on the days above designated.
 In addition to the foregoing terms, the District Judge will sit at Chambers at Mackay, Idaho, during the week commencing January 21st, 1918, for the purpose of hearing such ex parte matters as may be brought to his attention, and for the purpose of taking testimony in any water suits that may be stipulated to be heard at that time when it will be for the accommodation of parties and witnesses.
 It is further ordered: That this order be filed and entered of record by the clerks of said court in each county of said District, and that the same be published two consecutive weeks in a newspaper published in the respective counties.
 It is further ordered, that the second day of each of the foregoing terms shall be the dates fixed for the hearing of applications for naturalization in the respective counties above named.
