Origin of "Assassin."

The drug hashish or Indian hemp, for which Egyptians will pay such a high price, has given us our word, "assassin." These desperadoes formed originally a secret society in Persia, relates London Chronicle, in the seventh century, members of which were under a vow of blind obedience to their chief. They were called upon to perpetrate the most atrocious deeds, and before these ruffians were sent out to perform their grewsome tasks they were given hashish, by which they were thrown into a kind of ecstasy or intoxication. Hence they were called "hashishin," meaning hemp-eaters. The word became part of Western languages, but was changed into "assassins."

The Oldest Living Creature.

Among the oldest life forms on the globe is the shellfish, known as the lingula, a specimen of which was taken from Manilla bay several years ago. The genus, according to scientists, has remained practically unaltered for more than a hundred million years. With the extraordinary changes of climate and environment since the world began most forms of life with which science is familiar have been transformed or have altogether disappeared since the geologic ages. "That the genus lingula," says the Journal of Heredity, "should have survived for all these ages, and undergone virtually no change, is striking evidence of the fact that the germ plasma, which under some conditions, as in the case of the horse and the dog, is capable of extraordinary variation, is under other conditions remarkably constant."

Where Canes Are Popular.

IN THE GEM STATE

Among deaths in the American expeditionary force in France reported by General Pershing is that of Howard L. Botkin of Nampa.

John H. Rich, aged 50 years, died at Fruitland last week from a complication of diseases. His body was sent to Iowa, where he formerly lived.

School children of Ashton are buying a good number of thrift stamps and war saving certificates, an agency having been established at the school for this purpose.

A call has been sent out by the president and secretary of the Idaho State Association of Optometrists for the annual meeting, which is to be held in Boise January 28.

It has been decided that the town board will arrange to give a public reception to every enlisted man who comes to Downey on furlough as well as those accepted in the draft.

The Pocahontas council of the Knights of Columbus has secured the services of a vaudeville troupe from Ogden and will entertain Sunday, February 3, the proceeds to go to the war fund.

To guard against possible outbreaks of scarlet fever, the Caldwell schools were closed one day last week and the buildings given a thorough fumigation.

Ninety quarts of whisky and a large automobile were added to the "prohibition" collection at Caldwell following the arrest Sunday evening of Randall Sage of Ontario, Ore.

Canyon county farmers who counted on a steady market in Texas for their hay suffered a heavy blow to their hopes when word was received that cars in which to ship the hay will not be available for several days.

Because his wife denied claim of her dependency upon him as he claimed, James Henry Neilson is in the Twin Falls county jail awaiting federal action, charged with making false representations in his questionnaire.

The Idaho Seed Growers' association, in session at Idaho Falls, elected the following officers: A. J. Snyder, Springfield, president; M. A. Thometz, Twin Falls, vice president; A. H. Beasley, Idaho Falls, secretary-treasurer.

Lavon Williams, Dewey Arnold, Edward Levin and Henry Ricks, all young men of prominent families, are in the Madison county jail, held on a charge of highway robbery and assault on two Japanese women. Bail has been fixed at \$19,000 each.

Whisky ran like water in the subterranean conduits of Pocatello on January 23, when 4920 flasks of whisky valued at \$4 a flask were broken by sheriff's deputies and dumped into the sewers. The stock was valued at about \$20,000, dry territory quotations.

Announcement is made that Governor Alexander will invite the governors of Utah, Montana, Wyoming, Oregon, Nevada and Washington to meet in Boise this winter for the purpose of discussing the prohibition amendment to the federal constitution.

One hundred signers are petitioning for a company of militia to be organized at Pocatello. It will be an infantry company, provided to take the place of the national guards which volunteered for war duty. The petition will be sent to Boise immediately.

Although the friends of Senator Brady have known that as a result of the maturing of his large waterpower and mining investments he had become a millionaire, few were aware that he had acquired a fortune which is variously estimated at from two to five millions.

The Farmers' Co-operative Creamery company management has purchased two trucks and one runabout for its use at Payette this season. It intends to cover all the territory in gathering cream, so that the farmers will not have to spend time hauling their cream in.

Because the room in the high school building was too small to accommodate the women doing Red Cross work, and through desire to aid in the war work as much as possible, the Elks' lodge at Twin Falls turned over its handsome new lodge rooms to the Red Cross workers of the city and vicinity.

George L. Brumm of St. Maries, who died attempting to save Dolly McKinley, 9 years old, from drowning, May 26, 1917, has been honored by the Carnegie hero fund commission for his act of heroism. A silver medal and a pension were awarded to his wife and three children.

Attacked by three Mexicans as he was coming from Jarbidge, Charles Misner, a telephone lineman, was terribly cut and beaten, and when thought dead was thrown over a high cliff near Twin Falls by his assailants. Misner recovered and walked into town and three men have been arrested. Robbery was their motive.

A verdict awarding \$5000 to Frank E. McNeese as damages in his suit against George L. Phillips of Nyssa, Ore., whom he charged with malicious prosecution, was returned by a jury in the District court at Caldwell. The trouble grew out of the arrest of McNeese on complaint of Phillips, who charged him with grand larceny.

The skill of Professor Robert Blair of the Idaho Technical Institute at Pocatello as a violinist has received substantial recognition through the action of Fessauer Ferron, a noted violin maker of Chicago, in presenting him with a valuable hand-made instrument.

Jess Totterdell of Jordan valley was found guilty of assault with intent to commit robbery by a district court jury at Caldwell. The assault was committed on the evening of December 20 upon the person of Roy Fox, with whom Totterdell had been gambling.

What Can We Do?



In instructing schoolchildren in knitting, they must begin with the simplest things first and advanced to those that are more difficult, as in anything else. Some of the schools started out with the six-inch squares made of colored yarns on No. 3 needles, and after that they undertake mufflers, then wristlets. The squares are used by the Red Cross by joining them to make small quilts or coverlets.

Yarn and knitting needles can be purchased either from stores or Red Cross chapters. The standardized Red Cross needles are in three sizes, and their numbers and sizes are as follows:

Knitting needles, No. 1—135-1,000 inch in diameter.

Knitting needles, No. 2—175-1,000 inch in diameter.

Knitting needles, No. 3—200-1,000 inch in diameter.

The children use No. 3 needles. They are first taught to "cast on" and to avoid making their first stitches too tight. Beginning on the small squares the children practice until they can make the stitches even and firm. They must be taught to pick up a dropped stitch and sometimes ravel out and re-
