Following are the Precinct Boundaries, and the Names of the Persons Appointed to Act as Registrars of Each Precinct of Custer County, Idaho.

- 1. Bayhorse Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory the waters of which flow into Salmon river between what is known as the Bay Horse High Grade and Lion Creek. Jos. M. Frazier to act as registrar for said precinct.
2. Battle Ground Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory the waters of which flow into Big Lost river above the west line of Mackay precinct. Mrs. J. B. Hunter to act as registrar for said precinct.
3. Challis Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory the waters of which flow into Salmon river below what is known as the Bay Horse High Grade, below the mouth of Bay Horse Creek, and the Watson bridge spanning the river about 12 miles below the village of Challis. Dorothy Dore to act as registrar for said precinct.
4. Clayton Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory the waters of which flow into Salmon river above the mouth of Lion Creek and below the bridge spanning Salmon river above Robinson Bar. George Webb to act as registrar of said precinct.
5. Custer Precinct—Shall include all that territory the waters of which flow into Salmon river above the bridge spanning Salmon river above Robinson Bar to the mouth of Yankee Fork, all the territory the waters of which flow into Loon Creek, also all that territory the waters of which flow into Rapid river from the north and east. Mrs. James Jose to act as registrar of said precinct.
6. Darlington precinct—Shall consist of all that territory lying east and south of the Mackay precinct to Custer-Butte county line on the south. Mrs. B. M. Gray to act as registrar of said precinct.
7. Hooper Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory within the following boundary: From the line on the north dividing sections 26 and 27 from sections 34 and 35, township 15 north, Range 21 East, Boise Meridian, and bounded on the east by the county line, and on the west by the summit of the range of mountains between Pahsimeroi and Round valleys. J. A. Harrington to act as registrar of said precinct.
8. Sunol Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory the waters of which flow into the Pahsimeroi river north of the northern boundary line of Hooper precinct, and also including the territory the waters of which flow into the Salmon river below the Watson bridge to the Lemhi county line. Mrs. A. V. Miller to act as registrar of said precinct.
11. Stanley Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory the waters of which flow into Salmon river from the Blaine county line to the mouth of Yankee Fork and also all that territory the waters of which flow into Middle Fork above and including the waters of Beaver Creek. Flo Clyde to act as registrar of said precinct.
12. White Knob Precinct—Shall consist of all that territory described as lying between White Knob creek and Lucky Gulch and between the summit of the range on the west and a line parallel with the general course of said range, which line passes through the upper reservoir on the bar above the Empire Copper company's smelter on the east.
