

IDAHO BUDGET

Canyon county has now retired its limit of bridge bonds until 1922. The pupils of the intermediate grades at Collister are using scraps left from Red Cross work to piece a quilt to be sent to the Belgian sufferers.

The Jerome postoffice was robbed last week, and the footprints and other evidence at hand indicate that the offense was committed by barefooted boys.

Idaho will send a total of 33 men to training camp in a special call May 17. Railroad men, teamsters, plumbers, boiler makers and machinists will be taken.

Idaho has not only gone over the \$8,600,000 allotment from one-half to one million dollars for the third Liberty loan, but what is even better, she has doubled her number of subscribers.

Deil Blancett, one of the well known cowboys and round-up riders of the northwest, was killed in France last month during the big German drive, according to word which had reached Boise.

Canyon county ranchers estimate that they will plant 34,885 acres of wheat this year. This is 9758 acres more than was planted in 1917. This year's crop will go 29 bushels per acre, it is estimated.

Bannock county exceeded its Liberty loan quota of \$500,000 by \$207,800. Pocatello banks subscribed a total of \$331,900, and outside banks \$190,250, the Oregon Shore Line \$185,450, and public utilities \$10,200.

The Rev. William G. Simpson, pastor of the Boise Methodist church in 1875, when the first brick structure was built, died at San Francisco last week. He had served in the Methodist ministry for 43 years.

Boise high school students had subscribed \$27,085.50 in Liberty Loan Bonds and Thrift Stamps up to May 1. The girls of the school are responsible for \$12,652.65 and the boys for \$14,432.85 of the total amount.

It is believed that the fruitgrowers at Council will ship 40 or 50 cars of peaches this season. The trees in that locality were not in bloom when the frosts of ten days ago caught the fruit in the Boise and Payette valleys.

Two small children of Mr. and Mrs. R. E. Titus had an exciting ride through the streets of Nampa, when a four-horse team hitched to a dirt wagon into which they had crawled ran away with them. Neither of the tots were hurt.

Driggs has lost the high land experimental station and the indications now are that it will go to Felt, another Teton county town. The experimental station is to be built with an appropriation set aside by the last legislature.

Charles C. Farr, who is said to have a wife and four children living in North Ogden, Utah, was arrested in Burley on a charge of polygamy, on the advice of the Ogden authorities. It is claimed Farr was married in Idaho to a woman he brought from Utah.

Governor Alexander has appointed Evan Evans of Grandville to succeed himself as a member of the state board of education, of which he is chairman. Mr. Evans is a prominent Republican and recently resigned as chairman of the state central committee.

Monsignor Daniel M. Gorman, who was on May 1 consecrated bishop of Boise at St. Raphael's cathedral, Dubuque, Iowa, during a strikingly impressive ceremony, will be installed in his new position with the church at St. John's cathedral in Boise, Wednesday, May 15.

F. J. Cannon ended his life by cutting his throat with a razor, in a fit of despondency in his room at Boise, as a result of ill health. He had been in Boise but a short time, and was a mere shadow as a result of tuberculosis, from which he has suffered for some time.

The boys' department of the Pocatello Y. M. C. A. has just completed a thrift stamp campaign which gives it first place among the twelve Oregon and Idaho boys' departments competing, Portland, Ore., with its large membership, taking second place on the roll of honor.

A shrinkage in alfalfa tonnage in Canyon county is to be expected this year, judging from the assessor's figures. Last year there were 194,472 tons cut; the estimate for 1918 is 172,969 tons, a reduction of 21,453 tons. The acreage estimated for this year is 5128, which will be 997 acres decrease.

Women of Latah county are helping more than ever before and in many fields can be seen driving teams, planting, plowing or doing other farm work. It is believed the crop in Latah county will be planted at least 10 days earlier than last year, despite the cold spring and the shortage of help.

The state traveling library will be moved into the quarters recently vacated by the agricultural extension department on the third floor of the statehouse. The quarters used by the library will be given over for use by the educational department.

A convention of the Southern Idaho Four-Minute Men was held in Pocatello Monday. The session started with a noon luncheon at the Y. M. C. A. The afternoon session was held at Commercial Club hall and was addressed by several prominent speakers.

THREE KINDS OF GENTLEMEN

Somewhat Peculiar Distinctions That Are Made by Inhabitants of the Emerald Island.

Ireland is the only country in which it has ever been customary to classify gentlemen as of three distinct kinds or species.

Probably the distinctions are still recognized to some extent in the Emerald Isle, but two centuries ago, and even much later, they were defined respectively as (one) the "half-mounted," (two) the "gentleman every inch of him," and (three) the "gentleman to the backbone."

The first class consisted of descendants of Cromwell's soldiers, who, if they could ride well, were called "Buckskin Breeches," or "Squires."

The second class was composed of descendants of old families whose estates had been forfeited to the crown (for rebellion or other reasons), and who had been compelled to lower themselves by working for a living, in trade or the professions.

The third class—the "gentlemen to the backbone"—comprised the old stock, or folks who lived on the ancient family estates and the labor of the peasantry pertaining to their domains.




Military. An army officer's wife wrote to R. A. M. C. officer, saying her child was suffering during teething. She addressed the letter, "Dr. Brown."
