MORE FARMERS ARE NEEDED

It has been said that "he who causes two blades of wheat to sprout where only one grew before is a great benefactor of mankind" and so he is, and this being so, when we think in multiples of tens, hundreds and thousands, what a wonderful benefaction is the bringing of greater agricultural areas under cultivation, for the increased production of all kinds of food products?

In any section, increase in production is best accomplished when two farmers are encouraged to establishing where only one was before; in other words: if we can get two farmers to each work forty acres of any given eighty acre tract, or four farmers to work any given 160 acre tract and work these forties intensively, much more can be accomplished and everpone more greatly benefitted than when one farmer works the 80 acre tract alone, or one or two farmers work the 160 acres.




