Compulsory School Law

Section 150. In all districts of this State, all parents, guardian, and other persons having care of children shall instruct them, or cause them to be instructed, in reading, writing, spelling English Grammar, geography and arithmetic. In such districts, every parent, guardian, or other person having charge of any child between the ages of eight (8) and sixteen (16) years shall send such a child to a public, private or parochial school for the entire school year during which the public schools are in session in such district; Provided, however: That this chapter shall not apply to children over fifteen (15) years of age, where such child shall have completed the eighth (8) grade, or may be eligible to enter any high school in such district, or where its help is needed for its own use or its parents support, or where for good cause shown it would be for the best interest of such child to be relieved from the provisions of this chapter. Provided, further, that if a reputable physician within the district shall certify in writing that the child's bodily or mental condition does not permit its attendance at school, such child shall be exempt during such period of disability from the requirements of this chapter. It shall be the duty of the superintendent of the school district, if there be such superintendent, and if not, then the county superintendent of schools, to hear and determine all applications of children desiring, for any of the causes mentioned here, to be exempted from the provisions of this chapter, and if upon such application, such superintendent, hearing the same, shall be of the opinion that such child for any reason is entitled to be exempted as aforesaid, then such superintendent shall issue a written permit to such child, stating therein his reason for such exemption. An appeal may be taken from the decision of such superintendent so passing upon such application, to the probate court of the county in which such district lies, upon such child making such application and filing the same with the clerk or judge of said court, within ten days after its refusal by such superintendent, for which no fee to exceed the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) shall be charged, and the decision of the probate court shall be final. An application for release from the provisions of this chapter shall not be renewed oftener than once in three months.

PROCEEDINGS OF COMMISSIONERS

Office of the Board of County Commissioners, Custer county, Idaho, September 9th, 1918.
Pursuant to law, the Board of County commissioners of Custer county, Idaho, met this day for the purpose of determining the necessary levy on each \$100 valuation of taxable property of said county for the year, 1918, for State and County purposes, fixing the levies for the several school districts that have been certified to the board, considering any and all road matters, al-

so to canvass the vote cast at the Primary Election on the 3rd day of September, 1918.

Present: C. L. Kirtley, chairman; W. T. Oster, C. V. Hansen Commissioners, and E. J. Michael, clerk.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had:

It appearing to the Board that the returns of the Primary Election from all of the precincts within the county were filed in the office of the Clerk, the Board convened as a Board of Canvassers and proceeded to publicly count said election returns and canvass the vote of said election and make abstracts thereof.

And now the work of the board setting as a Board of Canvassers having been completed, and the abstracts and certificates of nomination having been filed with the Auditor, of Custer county, Idaho, on motion the Board adjourned until 9:30 A. M., Sept. 10, 1918.

Office of the Board of County Commissioners, Custer county, Idaho, Challis, Sept. 10, 1918.

Pursuant to recess taken yesterday, Board convened this day with all members and the clerk present.

In the matter of fixing a tax rate on the assessed property of Custer county for the year 1918. After due consideration it was ordered that said rate be add the same is hereby fixed at \$1.90 on each \$100.00 valuation of assessable property, apportioned to the state and county funds as follows to wit:

Special bridge	.10

And for the purpose of meeting the special levy for the Predatory animal fund, it was ordered that 3 mills be levied on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of all sheep and one half mill on each one dollar of the assessed valuation of all other classes of livestock and collected as other taxes.

In the matter of determining the special levies of the several School Districts which have been certified to by the trustees of said districts, it was ordered that said levies be fixed upon each \$1.00 valuation of assessable property in each of said districts and collected and apportioned as follows,

Oster ranch, had been closed contrary to law, it was ordered that notice be served on any and all persons obstructing said road to open same forthwith, and that the Prosecuting Attorney proceed under the law to have said road opened.

In the matter of the roads here before ordered opened in the Pahsamarei valley the Prosecuting Attorney is hereby instructed to proceed under the law against any and all persons refusing to open same.
