

ORDER OF REFERENCE

In the District Court of the Sixth Judicial District of the State of Idaho, in and for Custer County, Roscoe Hamilton, et al, Plaintiffs,

vs. W. G. Swendsen, Commissioner of Reclamation, et al, Defendants.

In this cause it appearing to the Court that this action is one to be tried before the Court without a jury, and that the parties are very numerous and that it would be a convenience to the parties and witnesses and the ends of justice would be promoted thereby, and the service in this action having been completed and the time for appearance having expired it is therefore ordered that a referee be appointed for the purpose of taking testimony in this action and that the taking of testimony be commenced and taken at Challis, Idaho, at a time to be hereafter fixed by an order of this Court, such order to be published and served as required by law.

It further appearing to the Court that J. H. Andersen, Esq., is a suitable and proper person to be appointed referee for the purpose of taking such testimony and to try all the issues in said action, both of fact and law and to report the findings and judgment thereon as provided by Chapter 256, Title 55, Article 6 of the Compiled Statutes of the State of Idaho.

It is further ordered that a copy of this order be mailed by the clerk of the court to each of the parties named in this action, and the parties are further ordered to cause this order to be published for two consecutive weeks in the Challis Messenger, a newspaper published at Challis, Idaho, prior to the time of taking such testimony. That this order be in full force and effect from the time of the taking of the testimony, to be hereafter made, but to be served and published as required
