Slug The Slug

Owners of pear and cherry trees have no doubt noticed an active, black fly, a little larger than a honey bee, flying about their trees this season. This is the fly that deposits the eggs which later hatch into slugs. Slugs last season caused great damage to the pear and cherry trees in southern Idaho by eating the top surface of the leaves.

The eggs at first transparent, later turning to a dull brown, have been deposited in great numbers on the upper surface of the leaves. Within the next ten days most of these will have hatched.

This slimy black slug resembles a snail. As soon as hatched they begin to skeletonize the upper surface of the leaves. If in large numbers, the trees give the appearance of having been scorched. This damage is sometimes mistaken for pear blight, so complete is the work of destruction. Becoming full grown, and having completed the first measure of damage, they drop to the ground and go into the pupa form. Following the pupal stage, they emerge as the active, sniny black fly and deposit the eggs for the second generation. This second attack will occur in July or August.

Two pounds of paste or one pound of lead to each 50 gallons of water, if applied now will control this insect.

If the cherries are ripe and arsenate of lead is undesirable, use one pound of White Hellebore to each 50 gallons of water. This must be fresh and free from all adulteration to be effective.

On small trees, air slacked lime, fine road dust or wood ashes may be dusted on the slugs with very satisfactory results.

The control of the pest should not be confused with that of the plant lice, as the treatment is altogether different. If you are not positive about the source of your trouble, call or write the Agricultural Extension Department at Boise and they will do their best to locate the source of your difficulty. In many cases serious epidemics may be corrected if taken in time thru the cooperation of yourself, your neighborhood and the Agricultural Department.


Henry Forsman called in Wednesday from Keuterville and advanced his two subscriptions another year.
