



Farmers' Union to Open New Flour Mill.

The Farmers' Union Warehouse Co., Ltd., of this city, will open up their new flour mill to the public on November 5th. The farmers have built a new mill, the size of which is 28 x 48, being four stories high including the basement. They have installed all new machinery of the very latest models in flour mill machinery. The machinery was manufactured by the Barnard & Lees Manufacturing Co., of Moline, Ill., who are known to be one of the best manufacturers of flour milling machinery in the United States.

In putting up this mill, the Farmers' have one of the best modern equipped flour mills of its size in the state and have spared neither time nor money in making this a first class mill. They are installing a new double stand feed roll in connection with the mill, which will enable them to do custom grinding of both flour and feed.

They have employed as their miller Mr. Frank H. Stephenson, who is very well known by most of the old timers, having been employed by Mr. Crawford some fifteen years ago in the old Cottonwood mill. Mr. Stephenson has a good reputation as a miller, coming here from Spokane where he has been employed for some time in the Spokane Flour Mill.
