Food Administrator, that storage tickets are not to be issued for a longer period than thirty days, and storage tickets should bear the following clause: "It is agreed that if the grain represented by this receipt shall remain in storage beyond the period of thirty days after the date hereof, the undersigned warehouse man is authorized to sell the same or to ship the same to the nearest terminal market for sale for the best price obtainable, and shall pay over the proceeds to the holder of this receipt, less lawful storage and other charges."
