ORDINANCE NO. 110.
AN ORDINANCE LEVYING A TAX OF FIFTEEN (15) MILLS ON THE DOLLAR ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATION LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF COTTONWOOD, IDAHO COUNTY, IDAHO, FOR GENERAL REVENUE PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING THE FIRST TUESDAY IN MAY, 1920, AND ENDING THE FIRST MONDAY IN MAY, 1921.

Be it ordained by the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Cottonwood, Idaho.

Section 1. That there be and is hereby levied and assessed a tax of Fifteen (15) mills on the dollar on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the Village of Cottonwood, Idaho for general revenue purposes of said village for the fiscal year beginning the first Tuesday of May, 1920, and ending the first Monday in May, 1921. Said tax to be collected by the Tax Collector of Idaho County in the same manner as state and county taxes are collected.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage approval and publication.

Passed and approved this 16th day of September, 1920.
