555 BOYS; 488 GIRLS.

Births in the state of Idaho from September 10 to October 10 totaled 1044, according to the monthly report of the bureau of vital statistics issued Wednesday. The report also shows that 301 persons died in the state during the same period of time.

Boys outnumbered girls in the total number of babies born by 555 to 488.

Of the 1044 babies, 931 have parents born in the United states and 113 are of foreign-born parentage. There were eight pairs of twins born during the month. A total of eight illegitimate children was born.

Heart disease and still births each claimed 22 of the 301 deaths during the month. In the case of deaths, the males are also the leaders, there being 165 males and 136 females. Seven of the deaths were by accidental drowning and five of these were children under 14 years of age. Tuberculosis was responsible for the death of 17 persons and bright's disease took 15. There were five deaths from typhoid fever.
