It is to be hoped that conservatism will rule and that the demagogues and plate hunters will be properly disposed of and no wild schemes or third party movement will be hatched. It is expected also that the convention will deal promptly with the McCune scandal.

Everywhere Reed made a speech during the campaign the Republicans were defeated. In Massachusetts, in Ohio and Illinois, McKinley and Cannon's districts, in Milwaukee and in New York, sweeping Democratic victories followed in the wake of the belly-band statesman, who proposed that the Republicans do their own voting, their own counting, and their own certification.

President Polk, of the National Alliance, claims that the sweeping Democratic victory of Nov. 4 is due to the farmers. He says: "People who believe that the issue was won on tariff lines are mistaken. It was financial reform that caused the sweep. This government was intended to be a government of the people, and it must cease, therefore, a policy which is dividing the great middle class, on which its safety depends, into two extremes—millionaires and paupers."

The Courier-Journal thinks that had Mr. Cleveland's famous tariff message of December, 1887, been his first instead of his last message, he would have been re-elected. That is very doubtful. It would simply have given the Republican party more time to organize and fry fat out of the manufacturers, and in this way Mr. Cleveland's message served to beat him. On the other hand, having accomplished his defeat, it served to inspire the arrogant, downhearted party with courage to go a step or two farther, which they did with the McKinley bill, furnishing an object lesson that fully explained the tariff question and brought overwhelming defeat.

It looks as if the great flurries and excitement in the money centers are going to help rather than injure the South. Money is what the South needs to develop her varied and in exhaustible resources of wealth. The Manufacturers' Record concludes this is the tendency, inasmuch as the panic has caused no halting in the industrial progress of the South. That journal says: "It is already being demonstrated that capitalists, driven from Wall street stock speculations by such troubles as we have been passing through, are turning their attentions to the South, where investments are safer and profits are greater. The South moves along as though there had been no sign of financial trouble anywhere. This is very strikingly shown in the record of new enterprises reported during the week."
