**NOTABLE IMPROVEMENT.**  
 The Western Union Office Fitted up with Modern Appliances.  
 Some improvements have recently been made about the Western Union Telegraph office here, which deserve more than a passing notice. Some time ago J. E. Fenn, chief electrician of the Western Union Company, came to the city for the purpose of rigging the office with all modern appliances and he has recently completed his work. The office is now supplied with a submarine cable, which does away with a network of wires about the office, and prevents the trouble in many ways. This cable is of the same kind used for ocean cables. It is rubber and water proof covered iron cable large enough to enclose twenty wires. There are two of these cables, one running from the outside to the new switch board, and the other from the switch board to the instruments. As a consequence no wire is visible in the office. This switch-board is of the latest pattern, being the same as used in the larger cities, only smaller. It is of great convenience to an operator and is quite an addition to the Clarksville office. The work was executed well and shows beyond a doubt that Mr. Fenn knows his business. Manager Reese has also had his office supplied with a new table for his instruments, and is now prepared better than ever to give the public an excellent service. Mr. Fenn is to be congratulated on his work and the company on its enterprise, while Manager Reese has the thanks of the public for his efforts to give a good telegraph service.
